Excavation Equipment and Trucks to use Harvard Road to Access Recreational Open Space (ROS) Area

November 2009

As part of the ongoing cleanup for the Havertown PCP Superfund Site, EPA will be using Harvard Road to access Recreational Open Space (ROS) area of the site, located behind the cul-de-sacs of Washington Avenue and Rittenhouse Circle. Within the next few weeks, EPA contractors will begin excavating contaminated soil in the ROS area, backfilling with clean top soil, and revegetating the area. Also, EPA contractors will install monitoring and extractions wells to pump contaminated groundwater to the treatment plant along Eagle Road.

Please be advised that excavation equipment and trucks will be using Harvard Road to access the Recreational Open Space (ROS) area for the next 3-4 months. A temporary access bridge will be built across the unnamed tributary to Naylor's Run, so excavation equipment can pass into the ROS. All work should take place during normal business hours. The work will not pose a risk to nearby residents. Although EPA expects the work to be completed in 3-4 months, the project may be postponed due to harsh weather conditions, and completed in the Spring.

Attached to this notice is the April 2009 fact sheet for the Havertown PCP Superfund Site, which provides background information on the site and an update regarding the current phase of the cleanup.
