More than 260 yards in the Jacobsville Neighborhood of Evansville have been cleaned of lead and arsenic contamination following a boost from American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding. The area cleaned up this year is bounded by Mary Street on the west, Iowa Street on the north, Elliot Street on the east and the Lloyd Expressway on the south. This work made the neighborhood much safer, especially for small children and pregnant women.

Although close to 10,000 yards still remain to be tested and cleaned, this initial phase is a major milestone in removing lead and arsenic contamination from a major portion of the Evansville community.
