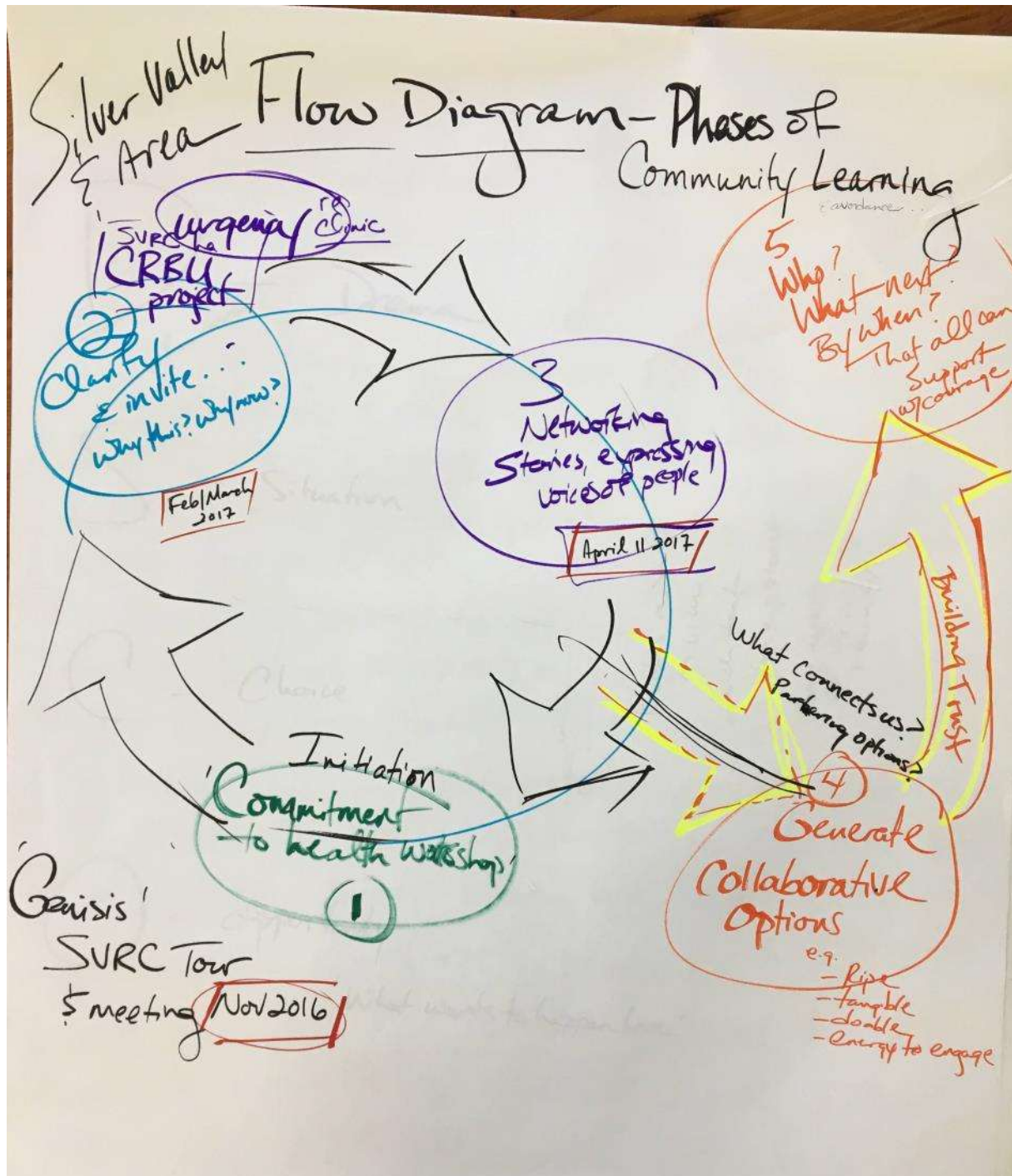

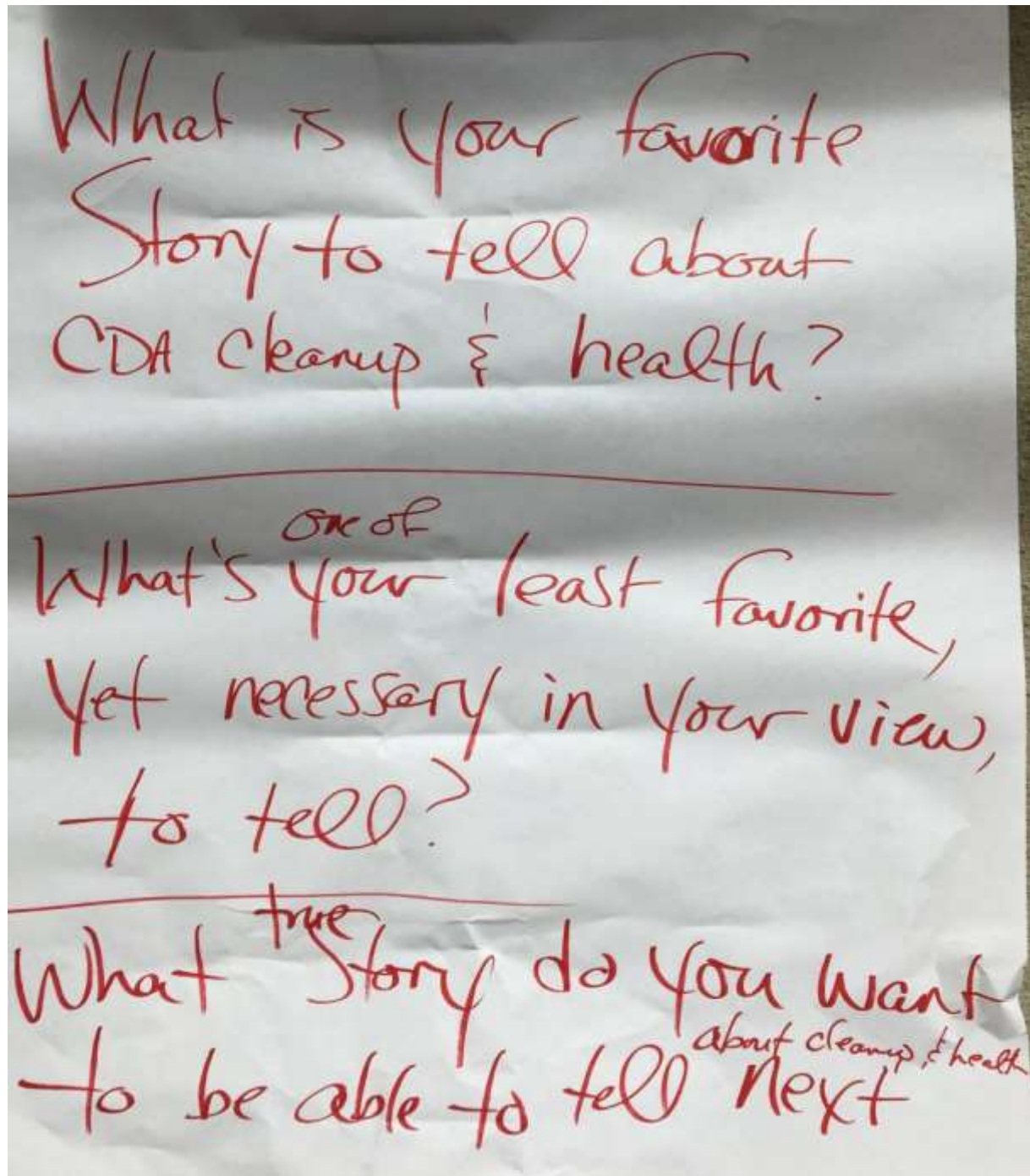

Flow chart on next page shows facilitator's chronological chart in response to initial question by participant: *What is the genesis of this workshop?* (start in lower left-hand corner in November 2016 and follow arrows to April 11 workshop, then see right side of chart depicting aspirations for this workshop day to jointly generate one or more tangible next steps that this community is ready for and can support.)

The focus was briefly on history, then on present and future possibilities for partnering and improvements moving forward. Panelists discussed what conditions they hope to create now and into the future.

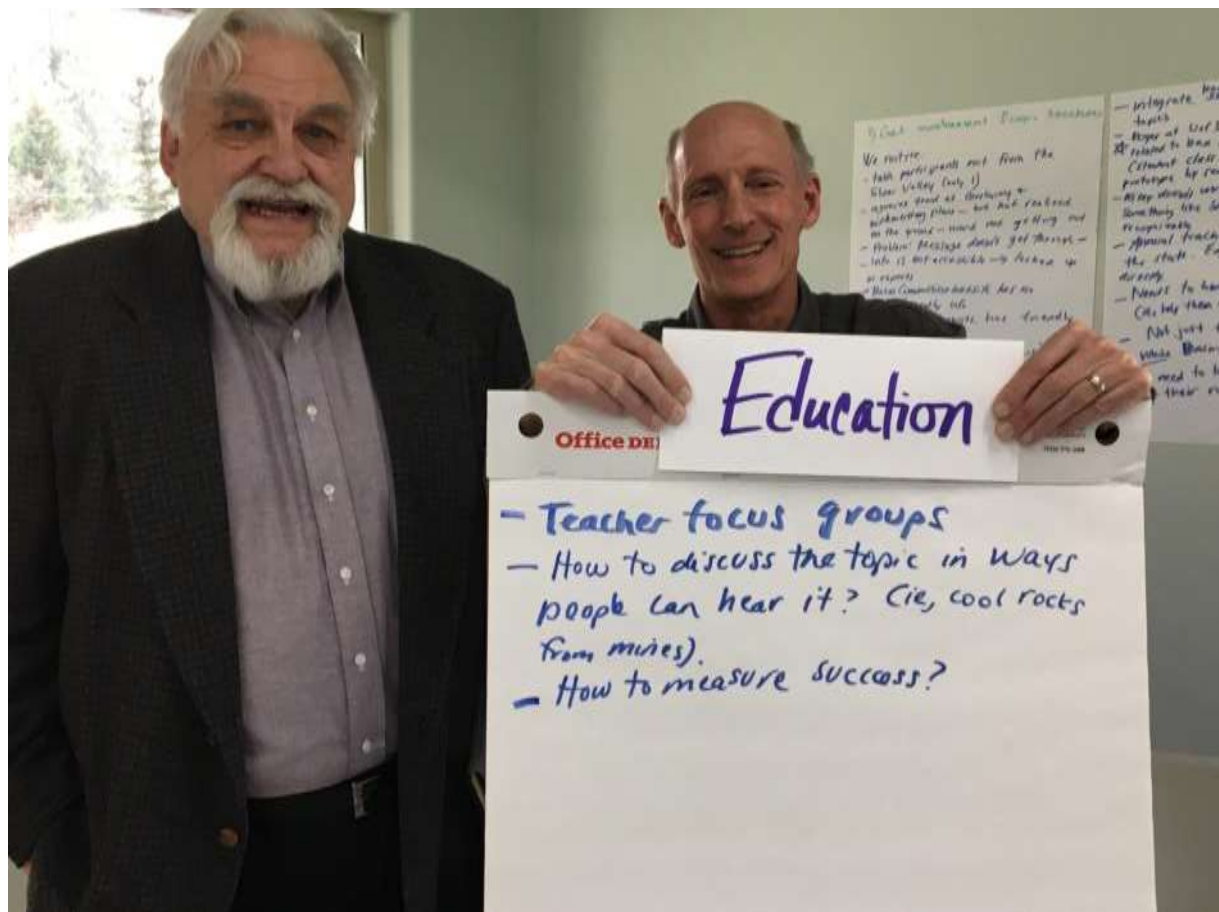

1) Get involvement from teachers

We notice:

- table participants not from the Silver Valley (only 1)
- agencies good at developing & implementing plans - but not realized on the ground - word not getting out
- Problem: Message doesn't get through -
- Info is not accessible → locked up in reports
- Basin Commission website has no public friendly info
- "Play clean" website has friendly info
- Curricula for teachers to use / PHD provides in-class education

- integrate ^{lead} education into existing topics
- Roger at UofI developing ap/game
- ★ related to lead exposure prevention.
(student class project) - how to deliver prototype by summer.
- Riley doesn't work for high school. Need something like Smokey Bear - immediately recognizable
- Annual teachers conference for all in the state. Engage w/ teachers directly.
- Needs to benefit the teachers too.
(ie, help them meet a requirement)
- Not just for the Valley - the Whole Basin.
- We need to know where people get their news.

- In the Basin people get info by word of mouth - it's the primary mechanism.
 - coffee clatches?
 - Who are the spark plugs?
- Two demographics
 - visitors → signs
 - residents → no signs
(similar issue on the lake)
- People aren't reading the signs - maybe license or other education opportunities
- Forest pass - with education
- At some point it's up to the consumer
- Some elected officials & others with influence are furthering myths - ie, bio availability.
- Need to be respectful of the mining legacy
