



RESTORING SUPERFUND SITES TO PUBLIC GOOD

Many once-contaminated sites represent prime opportunities to host public service uses and infrastructure that address community-wide priorities. Local governments across the country that own and acquire Superfund sites are restoring these properties for beneficial public uses ranging from roads and utilities to recreational resources.
