INTRODUCTION

This document is the Index to the Administrative Record for the Star Pin Mill Fire Site Removal Action. The Index cites site-specific documents and guidance documents used by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) staff in selecting a removal action at the site. Hazardous substances at the Site include, but are not limited to, asbestos and chromium.

The removal action, at a minimum, involves the removal of building debris contaminated with asbestos, chromium, and other hazardous substances found during this removal action. Other activities include conducting additional confirmatory sampling on the remaining building footprint; excavating additional soil, at the discretion of the EPA On-Scene Coordinator (OSC), where contamination is detected above EPA National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) and Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CTDEEP) standards for soil remediation; and delineating remaining excavated areas with geotechnical fabric and backfilling them to grade with clean soil.
