Re: Notice Letter for the Cinnaminson Ground Water Contamination  
Site in Burlington County, New Jersey pursuant to 42 U.S.C.  
§9607(a)

Dear Sir or Madam:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") has documented the release or threatened release of hazardous substances at the above-referenced site ("Site"). EPA has spent, and is considering spending public funds on actions to investigate and control such releases or threatened releases at the Site. Unless EPA determines that a responsible party will properly perform or finance such actions, EPA may perform these actions pursuant to Section 104 of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980, as amended ("CERCLA"), 42 U.S.C. §9604.

Under Sections 106(a) and 107(a) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. §9606(a) and §9607(a), Section 7003 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended ("RCRA"), 42 U.S.C. §6973, and other laws, potentially responsible parties ("PRPs") may be ordered to perform response actions deemed necessary by EPA to protect public health, welfare or the environment, and may be liable for all costs incurred by the government in responding to any release or threatened release at the Site. Such actions and costs may include, but need not be limited to, expenditures for conducting a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study ("RI/FS"), a Remedial Design/Remedial Action ("RD/RA"), and other investigation, planning, response, oversight, and enforcement activities. In addition, responsible parties may be required to pay damages for injury to, destruction of, or loss of natural resources, including the cost of assessing such damages.

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A Remedial Investigation (RI) and Feasibility Study (FS) were conducted at the Site by EPA. The RI and FS were completed in May 1989 and July 1989, respectively. The purpose of the RI was to define the level and extent of contamination at the Site and to develop information to evaluate appropriate remedial alternatives in the FS. The FS included the screening of remedial alternatives and evaluation of alternatives at the Site based on the results of the RI.

Based on evaluation of the information obtained by EPA in connection with the investigation of the Site, EPA believes that you and/or your company may be a PRP with respect to this Site. Under Section 107(a) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. §9607(a), PRPs include current and former owners and operators of the Site as well as persons who arranged for disposal or treatment of hazardous substances sent to the Site, or persons who accepted hazardous substances for transport to the Site. By this letter, EPA notifies you of your potential liability with regard to this matter and that EPA may conduct or require PRPs to conduct response actions at the Site. If response actions are performed by EPA rather than by the PRPs, those PRPs may be subject to legal action pursuant to Section 107(a) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. §9607(a), to recover public funds expended by EPA in response to the release and threatened release of hazardous substances at the Site.

EPA is providing a list of names and addresses of PRPs to whom EPA issued this notification (see Attachment 1). Inclusion on, or exclusion from, the list does not constitute a final determination by EPA concerning the liability of any party for the release or threatened release of hazardous substances at the Site.

On May 15, 1990, EPA issued a Proposed Plan to the public for review and comment. Copies of the Proposed Plan and RI/FS Reports are enclosed. The Proposed Plan presents the preferred option for addressing the ground water contamination in the area and the cleanup method proposed. EPA set a public comment period from May 16, 1990 through July 31, 1990 to encourage public participation in the remedy selection process. Your comments on the Proposed Plan and RI/FS Reports will be welcomed from July 27, 1990 through August 26, 1990. Your comments must be submitted no later than August 27, 1990 to:
