U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at the Computer Circuits Corp. Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its first five-year review of the implemented remedy at the **Computer Circuits Corp. Superfund Site**, located in Hauppauge, Suffolk County, New York. This review seeks to confirm that the cleanup conducted at the site, which included the operation of two soil vapor extraction systems and groundwater and indoor air monitoring, continues to protect human health and the environment. A summary of the cleanup activities and an evaluation of the protectiveness of the implemented cleanup remedies will be included in the five-year review report.

What is a Five-Year Review?

The purpose of a five-year review is to ensure that implemented remedies at Superfund sites function as intended and continue to be protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- review of monitoring data, operating data and maintenance records, and
- determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.

When will the Five-Year Review Report be available?

It is anticipated that the five-year review report will be available at the website noted below in July 2016.
