U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at the Genzale Plating Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its third five-year review of the **Genzale Plating Superfund Site**, located in Franklin Square, Nassau County, New York. This review seeks to confirm that the remedy selected by EPA in the September 1991 Record of Decision (ROD) is protective of human health. The selected remedy included the following components:

- Excavation and disposal of contaminated soils
- Installation and operation of groundwater treatment system
- Installation and operation of contaminated soil vapor extraction system
- Long-term groundwater monitoring.

A summary of the five-year review activities and an evaluation of the long-term protectiveness of the remedy will be included in the upcoming five-year review report. The report is scheduled to be completed by May 2020.

What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspecting the site and cleanup technologies;
- Reviewing monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records; and,
- Determining if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
