Re: Hudson River PCBs Site - Meeting on Uptake of PCBs by Fish

Dear Mr. Haggard:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and General Electric (GE) had scheduled a meeting for March 2, 1994, regarding GE's theories (particularly, those of Dr. John Brown of GE's R&D Center) on the uptake of PCBs from the water column and sediments by fish. However, GE postponed that meeting. At the March 23, 1994 meeting with GE on the modeling effort, we again discussed potential dates to hold the fish uptake meeting. GE was not able to confirm any of those dates because of activities at the Hudson Falls Plant site.

Since that time we have again discussed potential dates for the meeting, and of those dates EPA would prefer the meeting to be held on May 5, 1994, in New York City. Please let me know as soon as possible if GE can meet on that date, or please suggest an alternative. EPA is anxious to meet on this subject matter, and is waiting for GE's availability.
