This letter is being written to express disappointment in the United States Environmental Protection Agency for deciding to delay the study of PCB contamination in the Hudson River.

The Town of Greenburgh includes communities that border the Hudson River. This issue is of importance to our community. I urge the United States Environmental Protection Agency to complete the study as soon as possible.

The Hudson River is approximately 200 miles long from Hudson Falls to New York City. The river contains PCBs. These are significant contaminants that limit our ability to use and enjoy the Hudson River. PCBs remain in the Hudson River exposing humans and wild life to their effects. The stigma of PCB contamination has hurt Hudson River commercial fisheries.

Without remediation, present levels of contamination will continue indefinitely. Please complete the Hudson River Reassessment as soon as possible.
