Dear Mr. Hargrove:

This responds to your letter of October 16, 1991, requesting information on the presence of Federally listed or proposed endangered or threatened species in the vicinity of the Hudson River PCBs Site, which now includes both the Upper and Lower Hudson River, from Hudson Falls, Washington County to The Battery in New York Harbor.

Except for occasional transient individuals, no Federally listed or proposed endangered or threatened species under our jurisdiction are known to exist in the project impact area. Therefore, no Biological Assessment or further Section 7 consultation under the Endangered Species Act (87 Stat. 884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) is required with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service). Should project plans change, or if additional information on listed or proposed species becomes available, this determination may be reconsidered.

However, the Federally listed endangered shortnose sturgeon (Acipenser brevirostrum) is found in the Hudson River between Troy, New York and The Battery. This species is under the jurisdiction of the National Marine Fisheries Service. You should contact Mr. Douglas W. The above comments pertaining to endangered species under our jurisdiction are provided pursuant to the Endangered Species Act. This response does not preclude additional Service comments under the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act or other legislation.
