

## **Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at Butz Landfill Superfund Site**

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its third Five-Year Review of the Butz Landfill Superfund Site located in Jackson Township, Monroe County. This review seeks to confirm that all long-term cleanup work, which included connecting 50 homes to a public water supply and installing a groundwater treatment system, continues to be protective of human health and the environment. Two previous EPA reviews conducted since 2001 have confirmed that the cleanup remedy continues to function as designed. Concurrent to this review, EPA is conducting a pilot study to evaluate possible enhancement of the groundwater treatment system by injections of agents which expedite natural cleanup processes.

#### What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- Review of monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records, and
- Determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.

### When will EPA's Five-Year Review Report be available?

The Five-Year Review report will be finalized and made available in the administrative record repository for the site (see below), as well as online at http://epa.gov/5yr in September 2011.
