NOTICE OF CONTAMINATION

This **NOTICE OF CONTAMINATION** ("Notice") is made this 16th day of September 2013, by the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") to provide information concerning subsurface contamination affecting the real property located at 635 Newtown Road, Greenwood, Virginia and to provide a list of activities and uses that, if conducted at this property, may result in an increased threat of harm to public health or the environment.

WHEREAS, EPA identified the existence of contamination at that certain parcel of real property (the "Property") identified as 635 Newtown Road, near the City/Town of Greenwood, County of Albemarle, Commonwealth of Virginia, and more particularly described in the deed and its attachments recorded at Book 453, pages 503 through 511 in Albemarle County's Recorder of Deeds' office, copied as **Exhibit "A"**, attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the taxing authority of the County of Albemarle identifies the Property as Tax Parcel # 05400-00-00-01300, on the Albemarle County Tax Assessor's map #54 and identifies the current owner of the Property as Greenwood Chemical Company; and

WHEREAS, Greenwood Chemical Company abandoned the Property, stopped paying property taxes and dissolved as a company. In recognition that the Property had been abandoned, pursuant to Virginia Code § 10.1-1406.1, the Circuit Court of Albemarle County granted access to the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Environmental Quality ("VADEQ") under Court Order (Case No.: CL12000268-00) for the purpose of performing remediation at the Property.

WHEREAS, the Property is part of the Greenwood Chemical Superfund Site ("Site") where EPA conducted a response action under the authority of Section 104 of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act ("CERCLA"), 42 U.S.C. § 9604, and issued Records of Decision for the Site, in which the selected remedial action for the Property included dismantling a former chemical production facility, packaging and transporting drums and miscellaneous abandoned chemicals off-site for proper disposal, draining chemical lagoons, excavating sludge, contaminated soil and buried drums for off-site treatment and/or disposal and backfilling excavated areas with a minimum of 24" of clean fill. Contamination remains in soils greater than 15 feet below the ground surface and groundwater below the former manufacturing area and drum disposal area, collectively referred to as the Waste Management Area. The Waste Management Area and other relevant Property features are shown on a map attached to this Notice as **Exhibit "B"** and made a part hereof. The selected remedy also requires the continued operation of a groundwater extraction and treatment system to contain contaminated groundwater within the Waste Management Area, environmental monitoring and implementation of institutional controls restricting future land use on the Property, and

NOTICE OF CONTAMINATION

WHEREAS, EPA and VADEQ cleanup actions, completed and ongoing, have mitigated potential exposure to contaminants allowing the Property to be safely reused for agricultural, commercial or industrial purposes otherwise permitted by the Albemarle County zoning board, residual subsurface contamination does remain on Site. Groundwater monitoring data demonstrates that the plume of contaminated groundwater exceeding its respective safe drinking water standard, known as maximum contaminant level or MCL, has been confined to the Property. However, groundwater within the Waste Management Area is expected to remain highly contaminated with volatile chemicals as the remedial action objective is containment within the Waste Management Area. The following volatile contaminants of concern (COCs) have been measured at concentrations several orders of magnitude above their respective MCLs within the Waste Management Area:

- 1,2-dichloroethane (up to 860 micrograms per liter ("µg/l"))
- Carbon tetrachloride (up to 12,000 µg/l)
- Tetrachloroethene (up to 100 µg/l)
- Trichloroethene (up to 1,800 µg/l)

The promulgated MCL for each chemical listed above is 5.0 µg/l; and

WHEREAS, the conditions described above do not presently represent a significant risk to public health or the environment, nor do they require remedial action at this time. However, the disturbance of said subsurface contamination may significantly increase the risk of exposure to the contamination and create an immediate threat of harm or endangerment to public health or the environment; and

WHEREAS, this Notice itself does not and is not intended to create any interest in real estate in favor of the EPA, nor to create a lien against the Property but rather is intended to provide notice and information concerning the presence of subsurface contamination at the Property and caution interested parties against using the Property in any manner that may increase the risk of exposure to the contamination and result in an increased threat of harm or endangerment to public health or the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, the EPA provides notice that:

FIRST, the Property subject to this Notice is shown on a map attached to this Notice as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

SECOND, EPA concluded in the Records of Decision for this Site that engaging in any of the activities listed in the following subsections, may increase the risk of exposure to contamination and create a significant threat of harm to public health or the environment and, therefore, should be avoided by interested parties:

NOTICE OF CONTAMINATION

- (1) residential use of the Property,
- (2) on-Site potable use of ground water,
- (3) any activity that would adversely impact the operation of the pump and treat system,
- (4) any removal of the soil cover without written permission of the EPA and/or VADEQ,
- (5) deep excavation without a site-specific health and safety plan. Any soil excavated from the Waste Management Areas would need to be sampled and managed in an appropriate manner; and,
- (6) any new habitable buildings constructed over or within 100 feet of the groundwater contaminated by volatile COCs above MCLs should include, at a minimum, a foundation vapor barrier and the subsurface piping for a sub-slab depressurization system.

The Administrative Record includes the documents that form the basis for EPA's selected remedy for the Site, including the documents supporting the recommended land use limitations identified above. The Administrative Record is available for public review at the following locations:







MINUTES OF A SPECIAL
MEETING OF THE BOARD
OF DIRECTORS

A special meeting of the Board of Directors of Cockerille Chemicals, Incorporated, was held at the registered office of the corporation at Greenwood, Virginia, County of Albemarle, at 10:00 A.M. on January 17, 1968, pursuant to a written waiver of notice signed by all directors, which waiver was ordered to be attached to the minutes of the meeting.

P. O. Cockerille, Elsie M. Cockerille and Betty J. Snoots, being all the members of the Board of Directors, were present in person.

P. O. Cockerille, President, presided and Betty J. Snoots, Assistant Secretary, served as Secretary of the meeting. The President called the meeting to order and declared that the floor was open for such business as might come before it.

The minutes of the Special meeting of the Board held at the registered office of the corporation on April 23, 1968, were read and approved.

The first item of business to come before the Board was the sale of all the assets of the corporation to Greenwood Chemical Company. The President presented an agreement between Cockerille Chemicals, Incorporated, Greenwood Chemical Company, P. O. Cockerille and Elsie M. Cockerille dated December 8, 1958, which agreement was signed by all parties thereto. The agreement was read article by article and full discussion was had on it. The President next presented a Consent to Transfer of Assets






ORDER

This matter came before this Court on the Department of Environmental Quality's petition for access to an abandoned waste site located at 637 Newtown Road, Greenwood, Virginia, pursuant to Va. Code § 10.1-1406.1.

Upon consideration of the petition and all attachments thereto, including the affidavit of Russell F. Deppe, Waste Enforcement Management for the Central Office of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, and argument of counsel, the Court finds that (i) despite reasonable efforts the owner, operator, or other person responsible for the cost of cleanup or remediation under state or federal law or regulation could not be located, and (ii) adequate remediation or closure as required by Chapter 14 of Title 10.1 if the Code of Virginia has not been completed. Accordingly, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the Department's Petition is GRANTED, and further

ORDERED that the Department of Environmental Quality and its lawful agents may enter the Greenwood Chemical Superfund Site located at 637 Newtown Road, Greenwood,

Virginia, for the purpose of performing remediation as described in December 31, 1990 Interim Record of Decision, the September 22, 2005 Record of Decision, and the Superfund State Contract for Remedial Activities at Greenwood Chemical Site, as amended.
