Dear Mr. Prasad:

Pursuant to conditions specified in a permit (see attached) issued by the City of Chicago, radiation monitoring was not required to be performed at the above referenced site. AECOM, Inc. (AECOM) provided the required radiation surveillance from March 16 to July 15, 2009 for the excavation of various test pits and trenches for the replacement of gas mains and connections for several other permits issued for this project. However, with the areas of excavations completed in accordance with the referenced permit, AECOM found that they did not fall into boundaries of excavations according to the Streeterville Thorium Investigation diagram issued to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) by the City of Chicago Department of Environment (See attached figure).

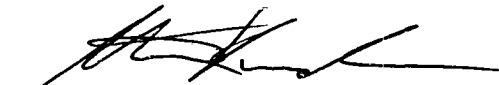

Restrictions:

1. A copy of the permit must remain on-site for inspector's review.
2. Permit fees must be paid within 24 hours of the date of issuance. Failure to pay will result in the immediate cancellation of the permit. Monthly billing accounts are not applicable.
3. All directional boring must be pre-approved by the Office of Underground Coordination.
4. Permitted Hours: SEE DETAILS
5. Contractor must secure plating over all openings in the roadway during non-working hours until such time when the road surface is restored.
6. Contractor must notify DIGGER at 312-744-7000 no less than 48 hours (exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays) but no more than 14 calendar days in advance of the start of the excavation or demolition, unless the excavation date was provided with the application and remains unchanged. Prior to 26 calendar days the Contractor must notify DIGGER to renew the dig date!
7. It is the Excavator's responsibility to request refreshing of marks when needed, but no longer than 28 calendar days after the last requested date.
8. When applicable, all excavation areas are to be clearly marked in safety white paint prior to calling DIGGER. White paint is not required for joint meets or emergency work.
9. Excavators requesting dig tickets are responsible for the protection of utility markings at the job site. Any markings of underground utilities utilizing utility colors, must be done by facility owners or authorized agents only.
10. Must maintain minimum of a 10 foot clearance at all times, otherwise a Full Closure permit is required.
11. Permittee must provide a sign which identifies the telephone number and company or person performing the work. Signage may be affixed to barricades.
12. Use of pneumatic equipment must not begin before 8:00 A.M. or continue after 8:00 P.M.
13. Alley pavement restoration is to follow within five days after the completion of underground work, weather permitting.
14. All street openings must be restored with concrete base to grade.
15. All pavements are to be restored in accordance with CDOT Construction Standards.
16. Work area to be backfilled to grade or plated when site is unattended.
17. No work in or use of the public right of way is to be done when a special event is taking place. It is up to the applicant to determine if an event is scheduled. To obtain a listing of programs or events within the City of Chicago please dial 311 when you are within the City boundaries.
18. It is the responsibility of the applicant to fund Traffic Control Aides if the City deems it necessary due to heavy congestion situations.

Restrictions:

19. Pursuit to City Ordinances 10-20-150 and 10-28-281.3 a re-inspection fee of \$100 may be assessed for each inspection conducted after the initial inspection.
