

NPL Site Narrative for Cemetery Dump

CEMETERY DUMP Rose Center, Michigan

Conditions at listing (December 1982): The Cemetery Dump is in rural Oakland County, near Rose Center, Michigan. From 300 to 600 barrels of industrial wastes were dumped in an old gravel pit near a cemetery in the late 1960s. Excavation of a trench uncovered 20 to 30 barrels that contained paint sludges, solvents, PCBs, and oils. Sampling of three residential wells next to the site detected no contamination.

Status (July 1983): EPA is preparing a Remedial Action Master Plan outlining the investigations needed to determine the full extent of cleanup required at the site. It will guide further actions at the site.
