

# NPL Site Narrative for Rose Township Dump

## ROSE TOWNSHIP DUMP Rose Township, Michigan

**Conditions at listing (July 1982):** The Rose Township Dump covers 10 acres. It is one of three sites within a 5-square-mile area in Rose Township, Oakland County, Michigan. About 5,000 drums of liquid industrial wastes (paint sludges, solvents, oils, PCBs, and greases) were buried or deposited on the surface of the three sites. Some may have been emptied into the ground or pits so that the drums could be recycled. The State removed most drums in 1980. Ground water, surface water, and soils still remain contaminated.

**Status (July 1983):** EPA recently completed a Remedial Action Master Plan outlining the investigations needed to determine the full extent of cleanup required at the site. It will guide further actions at the site.
