NOTICE OF LODGING OF CONSENT DECREE

The United States respectfully provides notice of the lodging of the attached proposed consent decree in the above-captioned action. No action is required by the Court at this time on this Consent Decree, or the accompanying complaint. The consent decree is subject to a thirty-day public comment period, and therefore, should *not* be entered until the United States moves this Court for entry, which will occur only after the public comment period expires, and the United States has received and reviewed any comments submitted. The United States also reserves the right to not move for entry, or to modify the consent decree, if appropriate, based upon the public comments.

This proposed consent decree, if entered, would resolve the liability of the named defendants at the Cam-Or Superfund Site, located in Westville, LaPorte County, Indiana. Under the Decree, the named Defendants have agreed to perform the remedial action for the Cam-Or Site, and to pay certain of the United States' and Indiana's response costs incurred and to be incurred in connection with the Site. The complaint accompanying this consent decree alleges that each of the named Defendants is liable under Sections 106(a) and 107(a) of CERCLA for the

United States' response costs as an arranger for the treatment and/or disposal of hazardous substances at the Cam-Or Site.

WHEREFORE, the United States requests the Court to lodge this Consent Decree, but **not** to act upon the Decree until the United States moves for entry, which should occur no earlier than mid-February, 2011.
