Site Name: MGM Brakes Superfund Site

Size: 5 acres

Existing Site Infrastructure: All major utilities are available on site. A concrete slab remains from the former plant parking lot.

Readiness for Reuse: The site is currently vacant. It can support light industrial reuse. Excavation for utilities and foundations is possible; however, the maximum excavation depth is about 10 feet.

Use Restrictions: Precautions for excavating on specific areas of the site.

SETTING:

- The site is located in South Cloverdale, less than 1 mile west of the Russian River.
- The site is zoned for Service/Commercial use.
- Site surroundings include multi-unit residential buildings, office buildings, a hotel, gas stations and convenience stores.
- Surrounding population: 0.5 mile, 1,124 people
2.5 miles, 9,610 people | 4 miles, 10,115 people.

REMEDIAL STATUS:

- Between 1965 and 1982, the MGM Brakes facility made and cast aluminum brake components for large vehicles. Wastewater discharged into a field south of the plant contaminated soil with polychlorinated biphenyls. An undetermined source contaminated groundwater with volatile organic compounds.
- EPA placed the site on the Superfund program's National Priorities List in 1983.
- EPA demolished the casting plant in 1992 and excavated contaminated soils in 1994.
- Cleanup levels for groundwater have been met and all groundwater monitoring wells have been closed.
