Use Restrictions: Access to site investigation areas or remedy equipment locations and use of groundwater for drinking is restricted.

- Site surroundings include light industrial, commercial and residential areas.
- Two neighborhoods and three schools are located within 1.5 miles of the site.
- The Helena Chemical Company Superfund site is located east of the site.

REMEDIAL STATUS:

• Several industrial businesses have operated on the site since the 1970s. Former operations resulted in soil and groundwater contamination.
