Site Name: Reeser's Landfill Superfund Site

Size: 51.5 acres

Existing Site Infrastructure: The site is less than half a mile from Interstate 78.

Readiness for Reuse: EPA determined the site had achieved the Sitewide Ready for Anticipated Use

performance measure in June 2008. The site is zoned for rural residential use.

Use Restrictions: Site cleanup allows for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure.

SETTING:

- The site, totaling 51.5 acres, consists of an unpermitted dump where waste was disposed of in a former mine pit from about 1970 until 1980. The dumped wastes contaminated soil and groundwater on the site with metals.
- Site surroundings include residences and agricultural lands. The site is zoned for rural residential use.
- Surrounding population: 0.5 mile, 44 people | 2.5 miles, 6,826 people | 4 miles, 25,868 people.

REMEDIAL STATUS:

- While EPA initially found elevated levels of metals in on-site soil and off-site groundwater in 1983, extensive follow-up investigations in 1987 and 1988 could not duplicate results from the initial investigation. Because the site no longer posed a risk to human health or the environment, EPA determined no cleanup action is necessary at the site.
- In 1990, EPA deleted the site from the National Priorities List.
- EPA determined the site had achieved the Sitewide Ready for Anticipated Use performance measure in June 2008.
