RESTAURANTS

SHOPPING

Downtown Pittsfield has its hub in Park Square, which is basically a small park surrounded by a traffic circle. From Park Square the main streets of the city (North, South, East, and West Streets) branch out in their respective directions. The area immediately around the square and continuing along North Street is considered the primary shopping area. Allendale Shopping Center, in the eastern end of the city, is another large shopping area offering a good retail mix. Along the main roads are other smaller "shopping clusters" usually anchored by a discount department store or supermarket. Every major neighborhood has its service stores providing for residents.

GOVERNMENT

Pittsfield is governed by a Mayor and single chamber (City Council) with eleven members: one from each of the seven wards and four at-large. Elections are held every two years on the odd year.

AUTOMOBILE LICENSE

Any person coming into Massachusetts from any of the United States with a valid license is eligible for a state license with a proper application to the State Registry Office at 333 East Street, 443-4946. A vision test is required. Fees are \$5 for application and \$20 for a four-year license. Information on other licenses is available at the Chamber office.

VOTING

In order to vote, a person must be a citizen, a resident of Pittsfield, 18 years of age or older, and must register at City Hall at least 21 days before a city election and 28 days before a state or federal election.

MANUFACTURING

Although Pittsfield is in the center of one of the finest scenic and cultural centers in the country, the city's principal economic activity is manufacturing. **General Electric Company has three divisions in Pittsfield: Defense Systems; Power Transformer; and Plastics. GE is the city's and the county's major employer. Its most recent building is the World Headquarters for General Electric Plastics.**

Other manufacturers within the city include a plastic molding and machine tooling. The Berkshire County area has a long history of paper



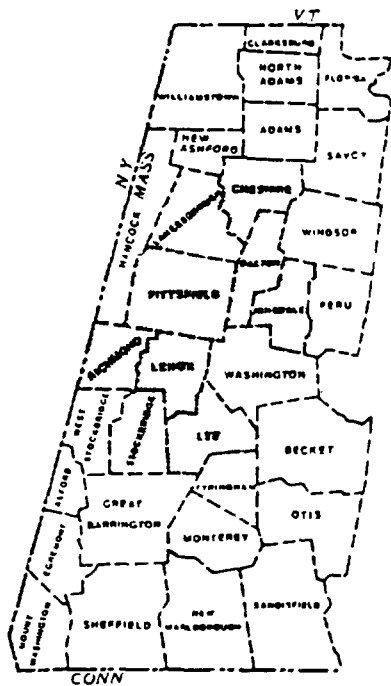
Located almost in the exact geographical center of Berkshire County, Pittsfield is the commercial and population center of the county as well as the county seat. It was incorporated as a town in 1761 and as a city in 1891, taking its name from British statesman and colonist sympathizer William Pitt.

Pittsfield, and the Berkshire County area surrounding it, offers a great deal to residents as well as the many tourists who return over and over to the county to enjoy the variety of attractions: a rich cultural mix; summers of theater, music, swimming, boating, hiking and camping; spectacular fall foliage; and winters filled with cross-country and downhill skiing.

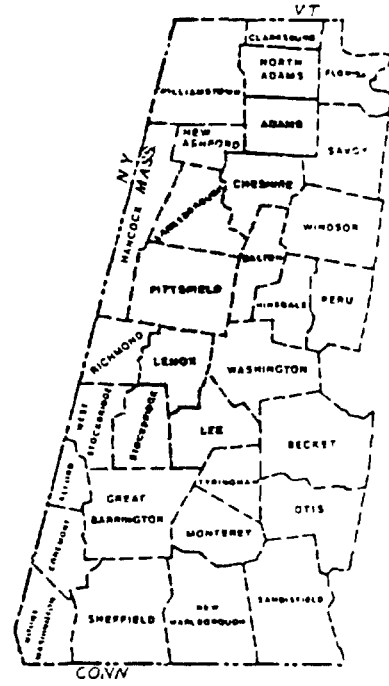
PITTSFIELD, MASSACHUSETTS SMSA

A "Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area", or SMSA (soon to be shortened to MSA), is a unit of geography designated by the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) based on data collected by the Census Bureau in its decennial censuses and according to specific standards pertaining to population, commuting ties, and metropolitan character. Thus, SMSA boundaries may change, or entire SMSA's be added or deleted, depending upon what data from the 10-year censuses reveal.

Based upon the SMSA criteria, Berkshire County has only one SMSA, identified by its central city of Pittsfield. The boundaries of the Pittsfield, Mass. SMSA are shown on the map below left. These boundaries are based on the 1980 U.S. Census and became effective in 1983.

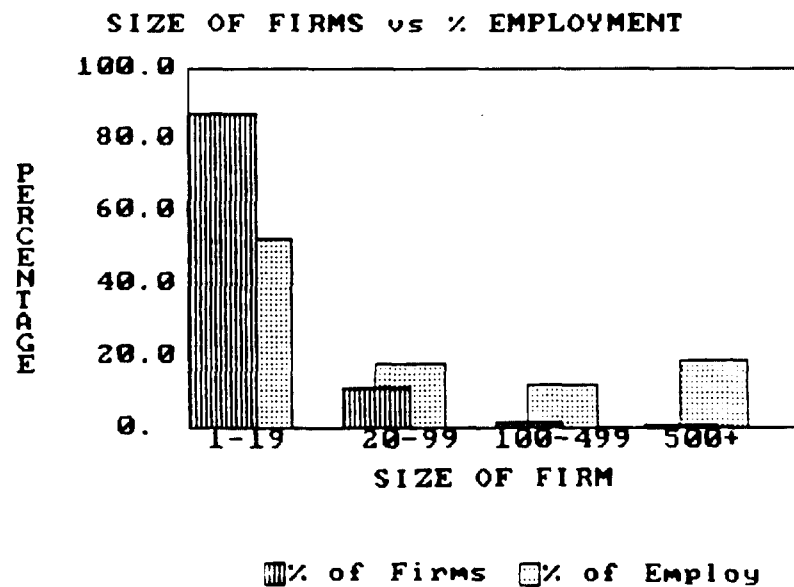

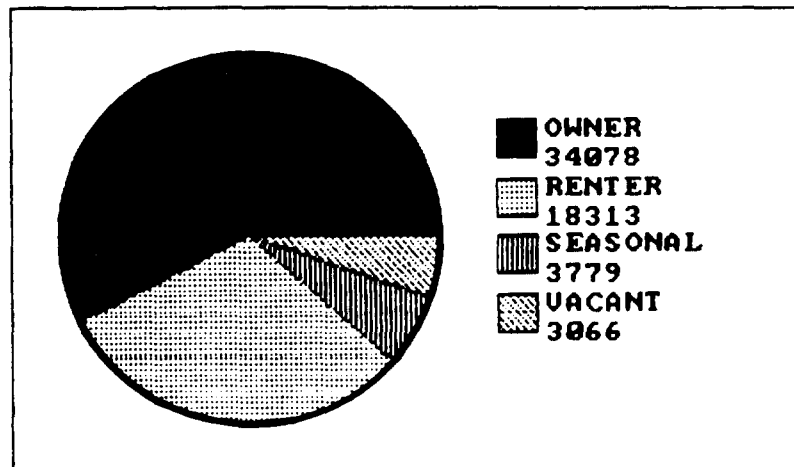

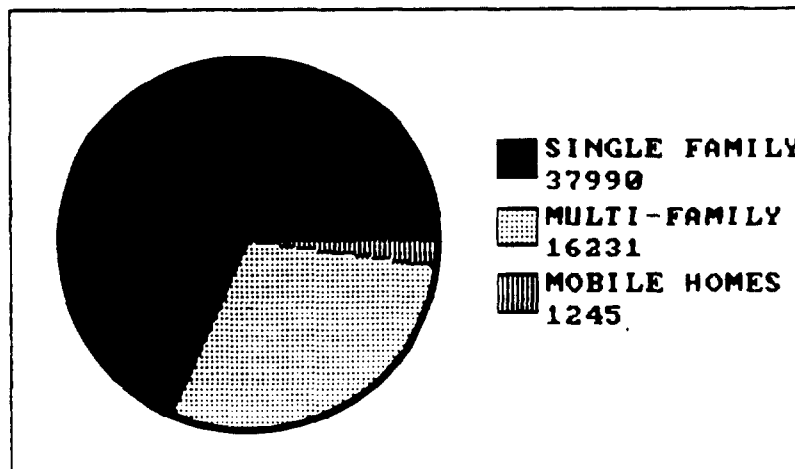

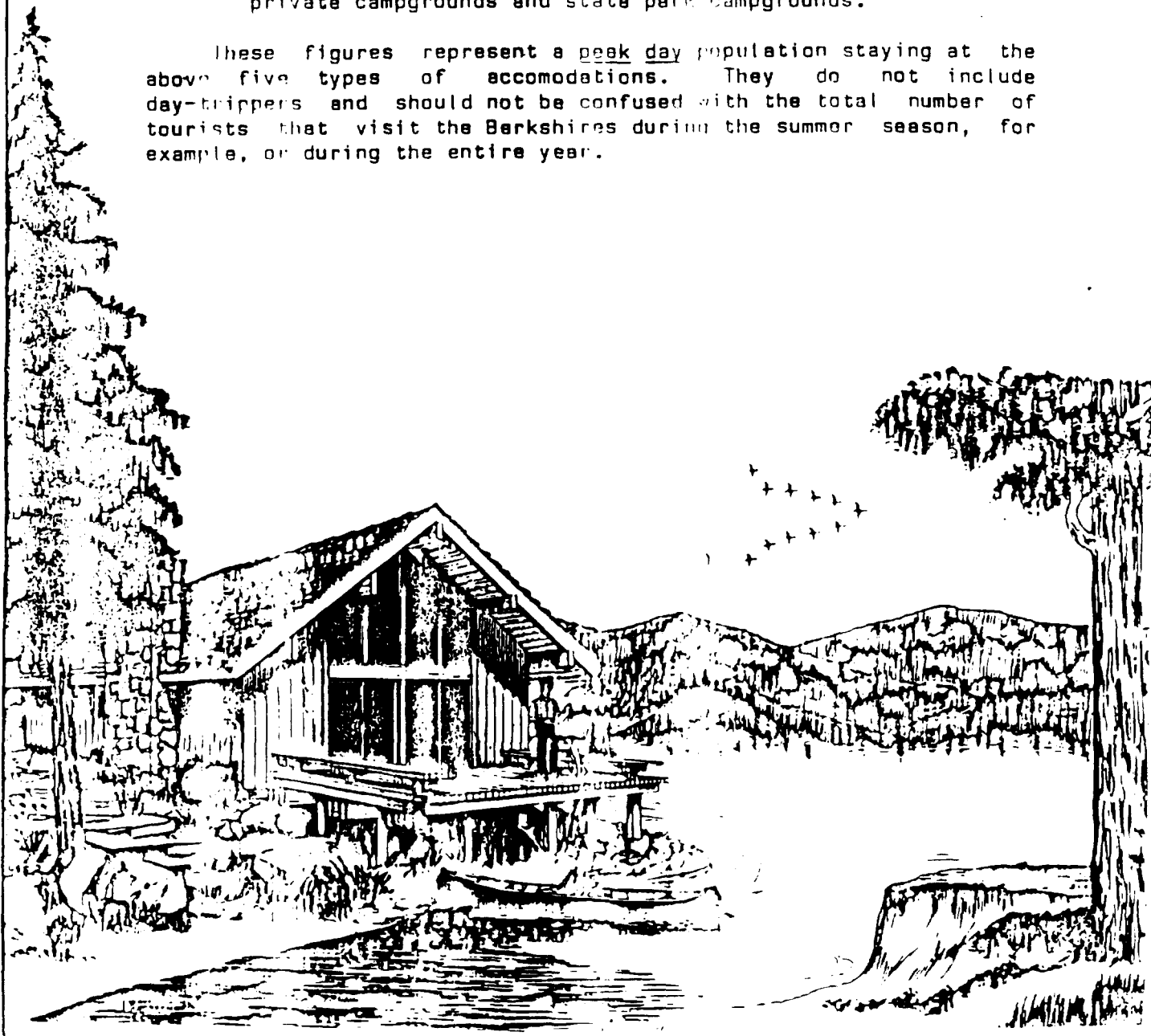

THE BERKSHIRES

Seasonal population estimates are based on an extensive analysis of peak seasonal weekend population during the month of July. The seasonal count includes:

- 1) identification of seasonal dwelling units based on field surveys
- 2) an identification of motel and hotel populations
- 3) an estimate of guest house, boarding room and visitor populations
- 4) an identification of the population at schools and institutions, and
- 5) an identification of the population at summer camps, private campgrounds and state park campgrounds.

These figures represent a peak day population staying at the above five types of accommodations. They do not include day-trippers and should not be confused with the total number of tourists that visit the Berkshires during the summer season, for example, or during the entire year.
