Subject: Formal Comment on the Creese & Cook Tannery Site Cleanup Proposal

Thank you for the cleanup proposal overview, presented Thurs, Oct. 25, 2018. Per the proposal, more than 39,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil at both the east study area (ESA) and West Study Area (WSA) will be excavated. Access to the WSA site for removal and transfer of soil will mainly be through Clinton Avenue.

We live at 6 Clinton Avenue. Our small residential neighborhood (with about a dozen families) sees only local people traveling up and down the small street; currently there is no access to the Creese & Cook Tannery site at the end of the road. There are no sidewalks along this road, so children and adults use this quiet street to walk and play.

It is unacceptable to all of us living on Clinton Avenue to see this quiet street turned into a thru-way for thousands of truckloads of contaminated and clean soil. The proposed Creese & Cook Tannery site project is extensive (~14 months ESA, ~33 months WSA) totaling ~4+ years of potential daily contaminant exposure for local residents. We implore you to seek an alternative access road to the Creese & Cook Tannery site that is safer and more appropriate for a project of this magnitude. Please take into consideration the short-term and long-term health hazards to the residents in the area. The potential inhalation of airborne contaminants and toxic dust from soil excavation/transportation remains a grave concern for the members of this community.

In addition to the formal request for an alternative access road, and proper elimination of airborne toxicity for local residents, we encourage the EPA to consider expanding the total land area of historical/archeological significance that will be protected and preserved. The Endicott & Russell Cemeteries (aka The Endicott Burial Ground) was established in the 17th century, and contains headstones from Revolutionary War soldiers that date back as far as 1740. Surely this area deserves adequate historical preservation prior to a construction project such as this. The wetlands, mature trees, and animal habitats in the area will also undoubtedly be disturbed by this massive project. How will these ecological areas be restored in the overall plan? Please consider detailing additional plans to renew/protect these areas upon project completion, and for generations to come.
