Per your request, attached is a map we put together depicting the relative locations of the existing town wells, Weymouth Woods parcels and the former Lee Paving site. Here are some guidelines on what we're looking for, don't have specific locations yet. Will need to verify with the public works folks the existing water system layout and nearest access to existing water system. This would typically be road frontage.

- 1) Wells require 1 acre and need to be 1000' apart. Not sure if there's a variance on the 1000'.
- 2) Well footprints are small. Small building (+\- 20' X 20') with fence. Building can be aesthetically designed and constructed.
- 3) Will require access for installation and future maintenance.
- 4) Will require a water supply line to the main water system. I'm thinking options are in the vicinity of Well 6 or 7. Not sure where the municipal water system layout is precisely, will need to get that from the public works folks.

If you need additional info for the state parks folks please let me know.


