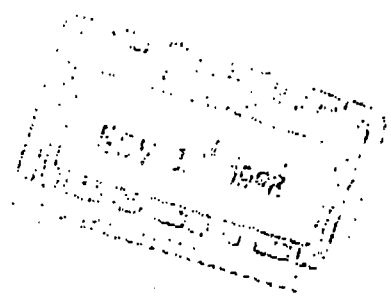
I writing to ask for your assistance in investigating the presence of a potentially hazardous condition on the Southwest side of the City of Detroit. The Department of Environmental Affairs believes that you may have the authority to correct this condition.

A barrel dump site has come to our attention at 6761 Bostwick Avenue in Detroit. Students at Michigan State University (MSU) were doing a property survey of the area as part of their community outreach practicum. Mr. Jason Stringer, of the Southwest Contaminated Sites Task Force and the MSU project manager in charge of the survey team, brought this site to our attention. The attached information was collected by Mr. Stringer's team. Mr. Stringer said that many of the drums appeared to be full and the neighbors were very concerned. For details from the MSU team, you can contact Mr. Stringer at 313-833-7273 or you can contact Ms. Kathy Milberg at 313-842-1961, for information from the neighbors.

RE: Second Letter of Warning

Dear Mr. Grace:

On September 16, 1993, February 1, 1994, May 12, 1994, and June 6, 1994, staff of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) conducted an inspection of your facility located at 6771 Bostwick, Detroit, Michigan.

The inspection revealed that your facility was in violation of the Michigan Hazardous Waste Management Act, Public Act 64 of 1979, as amended, MCL 299.501 et seq (Act 64), Michigan's Liquid Industrial Waste Hauling Act, Public Act 136 of 1969, as amended, (Act 136), and Subtitle C of the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA), as amended, and any regulations promulgated pursuant to these Acts. Your facility may also be in violation of Michigan's Solid Waste Management Act, Public Act 641 of 1978, as amended. As a result, this office sent your facility a deficiency letter dated August 11, 1994, specifying the observed violations and actions to be taken by your company. The response date in the letter by which time the company was to have responded regarding correction of all violations was August 26, 1994. To date, the necessary correspondence concerning corrective actions for all of the violations has not been received.

Specifically,

1. Rule 302, Act 64; and 40 CFR 262.11: It must be determined if any waste streams generated at the facility are hazardous waste. This violation refers to certain drums of wastes present at your facility. The documentation of these determinations have not

been received by this office. Enclosed is a copy of the MDNR's original letter of warning dated August 11, 1994.

Therefore, this letter is to inform you that this matter will be reviewed for possible enforcement actions and for penalty assessment pursuant to either Section 3008 of RCRA and/or Section 299.548 of Act 64. Submittal of any documentation to verify correction of the aforementioned outstanding violations should be submitted immediately.

Section 299.548 of Act 64, states, "A person who transports, treats, stores, disposes, or generates hazardous waste in violation of this act, or contrary to a permit, order, or rule issued or promulgated under this act, or who makes a false statement, representation, or certification in an application for, or form pertaining to a permit, or in a notice or report required by the terms and conditions of an issued permit, or a person who violates section 44(5), is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$25,000.00 for each instance of violation and, if the violation is continuous, for each day of violation, or imprisonment for not more than 1 year, or both. If the conviction is for a violation committed after a first conviction of the person under this subsection, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$50,000.00 for each instance of violation and, if the violation is continuous, for each day of violation, or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years, or both."

This Letter of Warning does not preclude nor limit the MDNR's ability to initiate any other enforcement action, under state or federal law, as deemed appropriate.

Dear Mr. Grace:

On September 16, 1993, February 1, 1994, May 12, 1994, and June 6, 1994, staff of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) conducted an inspection of your facility located at 6771 Bostwick, Detroit, Michigan, to evaluate compliance of that facility with the Michigan Hazardous Waste Management Act, Public Act 64 of 1979, as amended, MCL 299.501 et seq (Act 64), Michigan's Liquid Industrial Waste Hauling Act, Public Act 136 of 1969, as amended, (Act 136), and Subtitle C of the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), as amended, and any regulations promulgated pursuant to these Acts. Portions of the Act 64 and RCRA requirements were reviewed during the inspection.

As a result of the inspection, staff of the MDNR have determined that the above facility may be in violation. Specifically, staff found that the following requirements were not being met:

1. Rule 302, Act 64; and 40 CFR 262.11: It must be determined if any waste streams (waste generated at the facility) are hazardous waste. This refers to the 2 partially full containers of waste with hazardous waste labels on them that were bearing the hazardous waste number D002 the words "corrosive liquid", several red drums labeled isocyanate, and at least 2 green and white drums bearing the words "Vesco Rust Pruf", which were found at the facility during the inspection conducted on September 16, 1993. Additionally, during the May 12, 1994 inspection, the presence of numerous black drums marked as

solvents and as being for industrial use only was determined. Any liquids in these drums must be analyzed by a certified laboratory using the toxicity characteristic leaching procedure and the results are to be submitted to this office. After the initial inspection, subsequent inspections revealed that the 2 drums marked D002 had been removed from the facility. You must submit the proper documentation to this office showing that the waste in these drums has been properly disposed. Please take note that photographs were taken during all three inspections. When your facility was contacted by telephone, it was determined that you would send in the appropriate documentation regarding the waste(s) characterization data and the proper disposal of the waste(s).

Furthermore, if your facility is accepting any amount of hazardous waste it will be in violation of additional Federal and State laws. This, and storage of hazardous waste beyond 90 days will classify Grace Containers as a storage facility and subject it to all the rules and regulations that govern such a facility and be liable to civil and criminal enforcement action pursuant to these rules and regulations.

Due to the deteriorated and unsalvageable condition of many of the containers at the facility, the facility may be considered as operating as an illegitimate solid waste disposal facility and may be subject to the rules, regulations, and penalties pursuant to Michigan's Solid Waste Management Act, Public Act 641 of 1978, as amended.

Additionally, if your facility is discharging waste into the public sewer system it may be subject to the rules, regulations, and penalties pursuant to the Michigan Water Resource Commission Act, Public Act 245 of 1929, as amended, MCL 323.1 et seq (Act 245), and may also be subject to enforcement action by various departments of the City of Detroit.

You must respond to this letter by August 26, 1994, providing documentation to this office regarding those actions taken to correct the above stated violations. The MDNR will evaluate your response and determine your facility's compliance status and notify you of this determination.

This letter is to provide you with an update regarding the subject facility. MDNR staff have been unsuccessful in obtaining any significant information from Mr. Dennis Grace.

As you are aware, at one time there were two partially filled drums which were labeled as hazardous waste identified at the facility. The wastes apparently were removed from the property although evidence of their proper disposal has not been provided. Some rusted drums have been removed from the site and new drums had arrived. It appears the facility may still be conducting a drum reclamation business.

At the current time, Waste Management Division, MDNR, will not be pursuing any additional contact with the facility. There may be local ordinances which certain City of Detroit Departments may wish to pursue if blight or fire concerns continue. Please refer them to the appropriate local departments.

MS. [REDACTED] INFORMED US THAT THE CO. HAS BEEN IN BUSINESS FOR ABOUT THREE YEARS. SHE FURTHER EXPLAINED THAT A MR. BROWN WHO OWNS THE COMPANY ACROSS THE STREET (DETROIT IRON), OWNS THIS LOT ALSO. THE COMPANY IS DETROIT IRON WORKS. NO ODORS WERE IDENTIFIED.

MS. [REDACTED] - THIS NEIGHBOR HAS NOT SEEN ANY DUMPING OF MATERIAL BUT HAS NOTICED SOME BAD SMELLS COMING FROM THE SITE NOW AND THEN.

This complaint was generated by Bill Burbidge, Detroit Water and Sewerage Dept., Industrial Waste Control Division. The complaint stated that drums that were not RCRA empty were being rinsed and the rinsewater was being discharged to the Detroit sewer system, and that there were a large number of used drums at this facility. The property is owned by Bob Brown, the owner of Detroit Iron Works, which is directly across the street. No major activity has been observed at the site since May, 1993.

Upon arriving at the facility, access was gained through an opening in the rear fence from the alley. The front gate was locked. The base of the facility is concrete pavement and the property is fenced. Standing water was present amongst many of the drums and at least one drain appeared to be blocked with solid debris. Approximately 700 metal and plastic drums, at least one plastic lab pack, and several cardboard and paper drums are on site. Many of the drums are rusted and open and are of no value except as scrap metal. The cardboard drums were partially collapsed and leaking unknown solids onto the pavement. Not all of the drums were accessible for inspection. A number of drums contained liquids and/or solids. Two drums partially filled with liquid were marked with hazardous waste labels. These labels weren't marked with the generator's name, the accumulation date, and the hazardous waste identification number and name, although both had the words "Corrosive Liquid" on the labels as well as the DOT shipping numbers. At least one other red drum, among others similarly colored and labelled as Isocyanate, was partially filled with an unknown substance. The small, cubic, plastic lab pack was open and leaking a dark colored liquid.

Additional Information

Dennis Grace was contacted by telephone on 10-1-93. He informed me that he had been hospitalized and that the facility should not have been accepting or cleaning any drums during his absence. I informed him that the presence of the two drums with hazardous waste labels and of the other drums and the lab pack that contain varying amounts of unidentified waste may classify his company as a RCRA and Act 64 TSD facility. Mr. Grace replied that the drums with hazardous waste labels should not have been accepted and that the waste in the other drums and the lab pack was food waste. Some of the drums were marked as having once contained food products. I informed him that all unidentified waste must be characterized before removal and disposal. Mr. Grace stated he would look into this matter. A meeting will be arranged with Mr. Grace in order to develop a solution to these problems.

PARTICIPANTS

Entrance to the Facility was barred by a locked gate. I could see a fire had destroyed the construction trailer on the west side of the yard. 15 Pictures were taken. A large number of black 55 gal. drums that weren't there during the Feb 1, 1994 inspection were observed to be marked with the following: TONE Polyols, TONE POLYOL 0240, UCC-L61067, 09-18-91, Solvents & Coatings Materials Division, For Industrial Use Only, Union Carbide, TO: US Farathane Corp., 11650 Park Court, Utica, MI 48315. It appeared that these drums were in good condition and that some of the approximately 700 drums had been moved off-site.
