Radiation monitoring was performed at the above referenced site pursuant to conditions specified in the permit (Attachment A) issued by the City of Chicago Department of Environment (CDOE). AECOM provided the required radiation surveillance on October 1 and 4, 2010 for the excavation of a 3-foot wide and 50-foot long service trench in the vicinity of the permitted address (refer to Attachment B). A survey of the proposed trench area was conducted prior to the removal of pavement. After removal of the pavement, AECOM proceeded to monitor the soils in 18-inch thick horizontal lifts. Trench depth was approximately 3 to 4-feet except at the eastern end where a 10-foot section was excavated to a depth of 8-10 feet.

The monitoring revealed no indication of soils above the specified clean-up threshold established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) for the Streeterville area of Chicago. The USEPA threshold for Chicago's Streeterville area is 7.1 picocuries per gram (pCi/g total radium (Ra-226 + Ra-228)). Gamma radiation count measurements for the project were made using Ludlum Model 2221 survey meter and an unshielded 2 x 2 NaI probe (Model 44-10). For the instrument used, the gamma count indicative of the 7.1 pCi/g total radium threshold was 17,522 counts per minute (cpm). Field gamma measurements within the excavation and of the spoil materials ranged from a minimum of 5,000 cpm to a maximum of 10,000 cpm. Thus, there was no indication of an exceedance of the USEPA cleanup threshold.

- responsible for the cost of the original permit. Monthly billing accounts are not applicable to the 24 hour payment criteria but failure to pay the monthly bill by the due date will result in the same penalties applying.
3. All directional boring must be pre-approved by the Office of Underground Coordination.
 4. Contractor must secure plating over all openings in the roadway during non-working hours until such time when the road surface is restored.
 5. All traffic control will be the responsibility of the contractor and must comply with all MUTCD standards.
 6. Restore all lanes to normal operation during non-working hours.
 7. Must use flagmen and/or arrow boards to maintain traffic operations through the work zone.
 8. Contractor must notify DIGGER at 312-744-7000 no less than 48 hours (exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays) but no more than 14 calendar days in advance of the start of the excavation or demolition, unless the excavation date was provided with the application and remains unchanged. Prior to 26 calendar days the Contractor must notify DIGGER to renew the dig date.
 9. It is the Excavator's responsibility to request refreshing of marks when needed, but no longer than 28 calendar days after the last requested date.
 10. When applicable, all excavation areas are to be clearly marked in safety white paint prior to calling DIGGER. White paint is not required for joint meets or emergency work.
 11. Excavators requesting dig tickets are responsible for the protection of utility markings at the job site. Any markings of underground utilities utilizing utility colors, must be done by facility owners or authorized agents only.
 12. Permittee must provide a sign which identifies the telephone number and company or person performing the work. Signage may be affixed to barricades.
 13. Permanent base pavement restoration to follow within 5 days after the completion of underground work.
 14. All pavements are to be restored in accordance with CDOT Construction Standards.
 15. All street openings must be restored with concrete base to grade.
 16. Work to be performed as per plans and specifications.
 17. Use of pneumatic equipment must not begin before 8:00 A.M. or continue after 8:00 P.M.
 18. Maintain pedestrian and vehicular traffic at all times.
 19. Pavement opening to be backfilled to grade or plated during off work hours.
 20. Parkway excavation by hand, cut and replace and wherever possible.
 21. Permittee to provide all barricades, signs and/or flagmen as necessary.

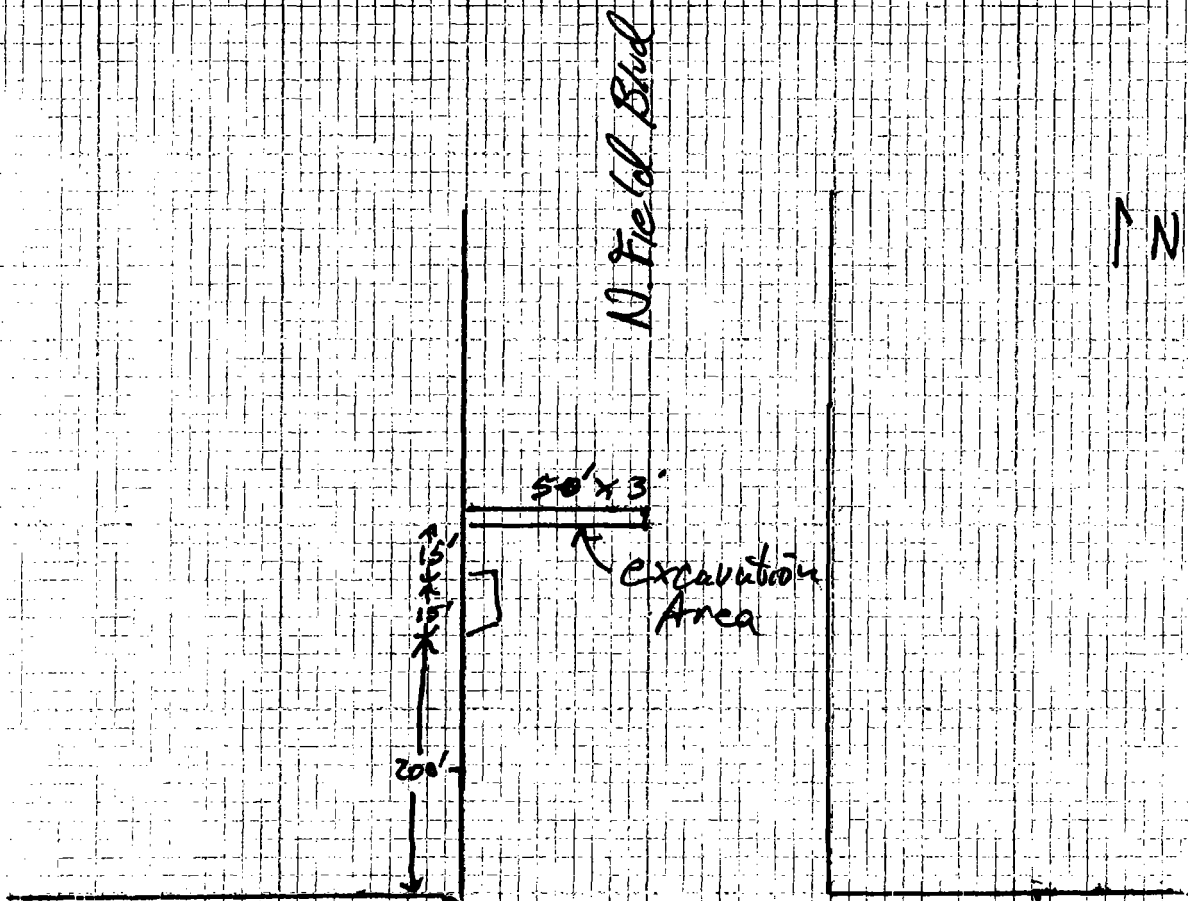
