Kalamazoo College breaks ground on new health and fitness center

Kalamazoo College held a groundbreaking ceremony for its new fitness and wellness center Thursday afternoon.

The \$9 million project is funded through the college's recently completed Campaign for Kalamazoo College. On Tuesday, the college held a campuswide celebration of the successful campaign that raised \$129 million, exceeding the effort's goal of \$125 million.

President Eileen B. Wilson-Oyelaran said the center is essential to the

college's liberal arts mis-

"We focus on the whole student; we focus on the balance of mind, spirit and body." The center, she added, would be "a common space in which the entire campus community - faculty, staff, students and retirees — can develop healthy lifestyles through participation in fitness and wellness programs."

The 30,000-squarefoot, two-story center will include:

■ A weight room and cardio fitness area for all students and employees. ■ Five multi-purpose

- rooms. ■ Two racquetball
- Expanded lockers for both the Hornet tennis
- teams and for general use. ■ An office and health assessment room for the campus wellness director.

The building is designed as an example of excellence in sustainability. "Our building is designed and will be constructed to the high standards of energy efficiency and resource conservation explicit in a LEED silver rating," said

Wilson-Oyelaran.

The Campaign for Kalamazoo College raised funds for five capital projects, which include the Weimer K. Hicks Center, the athletic fields complex and the construction of the Arcus Center for Social Justice Leadership building. While ground has been broken on the new fitness center, fundraising continues for the planned renovation of the college's natatorium.

Other funds are being used for scholarships and to fund seven new endowed professorships.

Two charged in firing of BB gun at school

Woman stabs father to stop attack

Man treated for superficial wounds after allegedly choking daughter's friend

A 28-year-old Detroit woman stabbed her father late Wednesday after he allegedly attacked her friend in the parking lot of a Portage gas station, police said.

The incident was reported at 10:05 p.m. at a Shell gas station in the 7000 block of South Westnedge Avenue, Portage Public Safety Sgt. Kevin Gleesing

Gleesing said the woman was traveling from Detroit to Chicago with her 51-year-old father and a 20-year-old friend when the trio pulled their Volvo

sedan into the gas station parking lot with the woman's friend at the wheel.

The man, whose name was not immediately released, has mental health issues "and began suffering from a mental disorder," so the two women pulled off I-94 and stopped at the gas station, according to a news release issued by police.

Gleesing said the women stopped to get water and Gatorade for the man to take his medication.

"They were trying to get him to take his meds," Gleesing said.

That led to an argument inside the car and a fight outside of the car in the gas station parking lot.

Gleesing said it is alleged that during the fight, the man began choking his daughter's friend, which

prompted his daughter to pull out a pocket knife and stab her father in the left

leg, just below his buttock. The man then ran inside the gas station, and police were called to the scene.

The man was taken by ambulance to Bronson Methodist Hospital for a mental health evaluation and for what Gleesing described as a "superficial" and non-life threatening injury to his leg.

Gleesing said police are investigating and didn't know if the man's daughter would face charges.

She was released at the scene Wednesday night.
