- * Feed your child a well balanced diet, rich in calcium and iron. Include nutritious snacks.
- * Don't let your child put non-food items in his mouth.

Pb lives in a mining area and loves the boys and girls!


His job is to help keep them safe and healthy.

All children that live here should be tested.


Pb says, "YOU SHOULD BE TESTED, TOO!"

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A healthy diet helps to keep children safe from lead. Pb eats lots of fruits and vegetables and drinks lots of milk. These foods keep Pb strong and healthy.


Pb knows that vegetables must not be grown in gardens where lead hides.

Pb says, <u>"EAT A BALANCED</u> DIET AND CHASE LEAD AWAY!" Pb also likes to play on his front porch.

He must be careful to look for places where lead can hide. Pb sees paint chips, sticks and toys. He never puts these in his mouth.

Lead can be in, or on, many items that are not food.

Pb says, "Do Not Put Things In Your Mouth-- EXCEPT FOOD!"
