NARRATIVE

7120.7126.7102 ARRIVED ON THE SUENE AT BARNHART FLEA MARKET TO FIND A LARGE NUMBER OF 33 GALLON METAL BARRELS IN AN AREA NEXT TO GLAIZE CREEK ON THE BARNHART FLEA MARKET PROPERTY. REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES.(ERIC SAPPINGTON, ALAN CORTVRIENT, AND ROBERT HINKSON) WERE ON THE SCENE AND TOLD 7102 THAT THEY WERE SAMPLING THE CONTENTS OF THE 53 GALLON DRUMS WHEN THEY SAW SMOKE AND FLAMES COMING FROM THREE OF THE DRUMS. THEY THEN NOTIFIED AN EMPLOYEE OF THE FLEA MARKET TO CALL THE FIRE DEPT.

MONR REPRESENTATIVES THEN TOLD US THAT THEY WERE FAMILIAR WITH THE COMPANY THAT BROUGHT THE BARRELS TO THE FLEA MARKEL AND THEY HAD AN IDEA OF THE TYPE OF MATERIALS THAT THEY HANDLED. WE LODKED THROUGH BINOCULARS AT THE BARRELS AND COULD SEE NO INDICATION OF SMOKE UP FLAME COMING FROM THE BARRELS. 7100 THEN ARRIVED ON THE SCENE AND II WAS THEN DECIDED TO SET UP THE COMMAND POST AT THE FRONT GATE. 7120 WAS LEFT IN PLACE NEXT TO THE MAIN BUILDING AND 7124 WAS MOVED BACK BY THE FRUNT GATE, 7110 WAS ADVISED TO STAGE AT THE FRONT BATE. 7102 WAS DESIGNATED INCIDENT COMMANDER. 7100 WAS APPOINTED LIASON SECTOR, 7105 AS PERSONNEL STADING SECTOR, 7107 SAFETY AND PID SECTORS AND 7109 AS FIRE UPERATIONS SECTOR. THE SCENE WAS DECLARED A HALARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENT AND HOT, WARM, AND COLD IONED WERE ESTABLISHED THIS WAS LATER CHANGED TO HOT, WARM, SUPPORT, AND COLD ZONES. THE JEFFERSON COUNTY HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE TEAM WAS KEUVESIED AND DISPATCHED TO THE SCENE AND THE JEFFERSON COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR, FRED BAUMAN WAS NOTIFIED AND WAS ENROUTE. JERRY CLOIN DISTRICT FIRE MARSHALL, (7103) WAS REQUESTED TO RESPOND TO THE SCENE. THE NATIONAL RESPONSE CENTER (REPORT # 170-282 PETTY OFFICER BENNEL) AND THE STATE FIRE MARSHALL WAS NOTIFIED. SEE SECOND INCIDENT REPORT FOR COMPLETION OF NARRATIVE.....

NARRATIVE: (CONTINUED)

A JEFFERSON COUNTY DEPUTY WAS ON THE SCENE (DSN591) AND SHE WAS REQUESTED BY THE INCIDENT COMMANDER TO CLOSE DOWN HWY. 67 AND TO DENY ENTRY TO THE SCENE. SHE THEN REQUESTED MORE ASSISTANCE FROM THE SHERIFF'S DEPT. AND MSHP. AN AMBULANCE FOR REHAB AND 7189 WAS REQUESTED AND DISPATCHED. JEFFERSON COUNTY NAZ-MAT RESPONSE TEAM ARRIVED ON THE SCENE AND WERE GIVEN AN ASSESSMENT OF THE SITUATION. AFTER A BRIEF CUNSULTATION IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE HAZ-MAT TEAM DID NOT HAVE FLASH PROTECTION FOR THEIR LEVEL A SUITS AND WE WOULD HAVE TO CALL THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS HAZ-MAT RESPONSE TEAM FOR THE PROPER EQUIPMENT. THEY WERE REQUESTED AND WE WERE INFORMED THAT THEY WERE RESPONDING TO OUR LOCATION. CHIEF PAUL MAYER OF SHADY VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT (7300) ASSUMED THE HAZ-MAT TEAM SUPERVISOR POSITION AND LT. JEFF HEIDBREDER (7307) WAS THEN APPT. HAZ-MAT SAFETY SECTOR. THE RED CROSS WAS CONTACTED AND RESPONDED TO THE SCENE FOR REFRESHMENTS. ANOTHER AMBULANCE WAS REQUESTED TO THE SCENE FOR HAZ-MAT TEAM MEMBERS MEDICAL EVALUATIONS.

THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS HAZ-MAT RESPONSE TEAM ARRIVED ON THE SCENE UNDER THE COMMAND OF BATTALION CHIEF DAVE WEMAN (804) AND HAZ-MAT OFFICER CAPT. RALPH BREAK (813) (SEE APPENDIX A). AFTER HOLDING CONSULTATIONS IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE CITY HAZ-MAT TEAM WOULD MAKE AN INSPECTION OF THE SCENE AND REPORT BACK. AFTER THE INITIAL INSPECTION WAS MADE THE TEAM MEMBERS MEPORTED THAT SOME BARRELS WERE MISSING THE 2 1/4" SCREW CAPS FROM THE BARREL LID AND THEY DID NOT HAVE ENOUGH CAPS TO PLUG ALL OF THEM. A CALL WAS PLACED TO DAVE MANGLESDOHF OF HOME SERVICE OIL CO., WHO DELIVERED MORE CAPS TO THE SCENE. THE HAZ-MAT TEAM THEN RE-ENTERED THE HOT ZONE AND RECAPPED ALL BUT THREE OF THE BARRELS. THEY WERE UNABLE TO CAP THE REMAINING THREE DUE TO DISTORTIONS OF THE TOPS OF THE MARRELS.

THEY THEN CHECKED FOR HEAT AROUND THE BARRELS WITH A HEAT DETECTOR AND CHECKED FOR FLAMMABLE VAPORS WITH AN EXPLOSINETER AND FOUND NO HEAT INDICATIONS OR FLAMMABLE VAPOR READINGS.

AFTER A CONFERENCE INCLUDING THE OWNER, MR. EDWARD SAMNEE, IT WAS DECIDED TO ROPE OFF THE HOT ZONE AND MR. SAMNEE WILL POST A GUARD OVERNIGHT. THE DNR WILL RETURN AND COMPLETE THEIR SAMPLING ON THURSDAY, APRIL 29, 1993.

EQUIPMENT AND APPARATUS WERE PUT BACK IN SERVICE AND THE ALARM WAS STRUCK OUT AT 21:18 HOURS.

On the above date the St. Louis Fire Department HazMat Task Force was requested by the Rock Community Fire Protection District, in Jefferson County, to respond to a hazmat incident. The HazNat Task Force and Battalion Chief \$04 were sent.

#### EACK CHORNED

Rook Community FPD and the Jefferson County HazMat Team were

On the scene of a large barrel storage area located on the ground as the terminate fire masket. The initial report was given by Eric Sappington of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Me stated that he had opened several barrels and after a while he saw flames coming from one of them. (We were unable to find out why DNR was investigating this site.) He notified Rock Community FFD who intern requested the Jefferson County HazMat Team. This team did not have any entry suits with flash protection. The Rock Community Incident Commander then requested our Task Force. 4.2

The owner of the Flee Market, Ed Sennee, stated that he purchased these barrels from a Peerless Industrial Paint Coatings, which is located in the City of St. Louis, and transported them down to his Flee Market. Mr. Sennee stated that Peerless told him the barrels were empty and that any liquid in them was rain water. Unit 900 contacted George Horne, the St. Louis Fire Marshal, to find out any other information that might be pertinent to this incident. He informed us that Peerless was under court order not to remove, or have removed, any of the barrels from their property. This information was given to the Rock Community IC. The State Fire Marshal was also notified and a representative, Tarry Deguents, was dispatched to the incident.

#### BARREL IDENTIFICATION

There were approximately 150 barrels on the property. The contents of the barrels that were in question were identified as;

- 1. Methyl Ethyl Ketone
- 2. Ethyl Benzene
- 3. Xylene

Unit 900 contacted Fire Alarm and requested the MSDS's for these materials. Fire Alarm faxed these to Unit 900.

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# ST. LOUIS FIRE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES

After receiving the MBDS's the HasHat Task Force made three (3) entries into the hot zone. The first two were conducted in Level A suits with flash protection.

The first entry was to determine the number of barrels that were open, check for fire or heat, check the air with the CGI, check for leaks or evidence of leaks, and replace bung covers. All checks were negative/within limits and several barrels were sealed before the 15 minute entry time was up.

The second entry was made to complete the scaling of the the remaining open barrels. All but three of the barrels were scaled. The three that were noted scaled had do size openings or obstructions. These were identified as numbers 3, 11, & 63.

The third entry was made to take combustible gas readings around the three open barrels. The readings proved negative.

On April 28. 1993 at 1435 hours the Jefferson County Hazardous Material Emergency Response Team (JCHMERT) was requested to assist the Rock Community Fire Protection District at the Darnhart Flee Market, 6850 Highway 61-67, Barnhart, Mo 63012. Unit #591 was dispatched at 1435 hours while other members of the JCHMERT warm mulified by Jefferson County 911 Dispatch.

Unit #591 experienced failure of the left rear tire and was placed out of wervice at 1526 hours. After repairs were completed (1537 hours), Unit #591 continued their response and arrived at the scene at 1539 hours.

Upon arrival, Technician Fitzgerald reported to the Command Post which was operated by Assistant Chief McCredie of the Rock Community Fire Protection District, and was brinfed of the Inclaent. The Team Teo Dy Technician Fitzgerald Proceeded to Operations Sector which was operated by Captain Matthew Mayer of the Rock Community Fire Protection District.

Prior to arrival of the Team, the hot, warm and cold zones had been established. After utilization of reference materials, the zones were moved closer to the incident. The Team then conferred with Operations and determined that two foam lines, two water lines and one muster stream device would be set up for protection of the entry team. As this was being done, a decontamination corridor was established. It was then determined that the initial entry team would be Technician Fitzgerald and specialist Siegel.

The purpose of the initial entry was for reconnaissance only. Due to the fact that flash suits were not available to the Team, contact was made to the St. Louis Fire Department for the necessary equipment.

Crews proceeded to set up necessary protection lines, decomend to ready entry team. The St. Louis Fire Department arrived on the scene at 1650 hours and determination was made by the Command Fost to defer entry until more information could be gathered.

It. being the policy of the St. Louis Fire Department for their Team only to utilize their equipment, a decision was made to engage their Team for entry into the hot zone. At this point, JCHMERT was utilized for support functions.

Three entries were made into the site by the St. Louis Fire Department and decontaminution was performed by JCHMERT (see St. Louis Fire Department's report for further details of entries).

All wastes were removed after mitigation and placed into a 55 gallon drum, sealed and labelad.

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Unit #591 returned in service at 2101 hours. End of report.
