#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Project Background

This report presents the results of the Limited Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) search conducted for the R and O Processors site in Granby, Missouri. This PRP search was conducted to support EPA oversight of the site investigation.

R and O Processors, Inc. was a metal finishing business that performed various plating processes, including processes using cyanide. facilitated the plating of brass and copper on steel. Processes not using cyanide were mainly zinc, chromium, nickel, and black oxide plating on steel and anodizing of aluminum. According to a Missouri Department of Natural Resources inspection report, tin plating was also done in the past and wastes from this process are still on site. Waste generated from all of these processes include spent stripping solutions bearing cyanide and metals, spent acids and caustics, and rinse solutions.

Spent solutions were either stored in outdoor concrete vats or recycled. MDNR has inspected the vats and the recycling system. According to MDNR, the vats show signs of leakage and the recycling system has been inoperative since approximately October 1987.

The original Articles of Incorporation list two owners; Robert Moffet and Orval K. Taylor, Jr. Although documentation is lacking, ownership has apparently changed and Robert W. Moffet is the sole proprietor. R and O Processors has been in operation at the P.O. Box 351, West Highway 60 site (Figure 1) since 1981.

The facility has a history of compliance discrepancies with MDNR, as described in section 2.0 of this report. Operations were shut down (1990, exact date unknown) due to financial deficiencies. The owners reportedly are planning to file for personal and business bankruptcy.

#### 1.2 Scope of Work

The Ecology and Environment, Inc., (E & E) Technical Assistance Team (TAT) received a Technical Direction Document (TDD# T07-9105-005) to perform a PRP search for R and O Processors. Specific elements for the PRP search included reviews of E & E's Preliminary Removal Assessment Report and MDNR's files, a deed search, and an assessment of the financial capabilities of the identified PRPs. These elements were accomplished through the completion of four basic tasks.

#### TASK 1: Research Sources of Information

Completion of this task includes the written report from E & E in Attachment A, information from MDNR site investigations in Attachment B, and the Joint Voluntary Petition from MDNR in Attachment I.

#### TASK 2: Conduct a Title Search

The title search in Attachment C was completed under a subcontract to Newton County Abstract and Title Company of Neosho, Missouri. The chain of ownership, derived from the title search, is presented in 3.0, with the deeds of property in Attachments D and E.

#### TASK 3: Develop Basic PRP Information

For individuals who were identified as PRP's, basic information, including current addresses and relationship to the facility, was obtained through the Certificate of Incorporation (Attachment F). This information is presented in section 4.0.

#### TASK 4: Develop PRP Financial Information

For individuals who were identified as PRP's, types and amounts of real estate assets were identified through the Granby County Assessor's office and through the Dunn and Bradstreet Report provided in Attachment G.

#### 2.0 SITE HISTORY

R and O Processors, Inc. was incorporated in Missouri on September 17, 1973. The original location of the facility was Main and Church Street, Granby, Missouri. The two shareholders listed on the original incorporation document (Attachment F) are:

Robert W. Moffet Orval K. Taylor, Jr.

In 1981, R and O Processors, Inc. relocated. It purchased parcel 8.02 out of Section 10, Township 25, and Range 31 from Robert W. Moffet (Figure 3). During the same year, R and O Processors built a new facility on parcel 8.02. The new address was P.O. Box 351, West Highway 60, Granby, Missouri.

On or about June 27, 1985, MDNR personnel responded to a request for assistance involving the possible release of hazardous materials at the R and O Processors Main and Church Streets address, an abandoned location. Subsequently, on November 26, 1985, a RCRA inspection of the facility revealed several violations including storage of hazardous waste without an interim status permit and allowing cyanide- contaminated wastewater, a listed hazardous waste, to overflow from outside holding tanks onto the ground. A Notice of Violation was issued immediately. On May 27, 1986, an Abatement Order was issued by MDNR to the company and on December 10, 1986, an amendment to the original Abatement Order was issued. Neither the Order nor the Amendment was appealed; however, the company has taken no action to correct the violations cited therein. On March 27, 1987, an inspection of the new facility was performed and the company was again found to be in violation. The matter was referred to the Office of the Missouri Attorney General for legal action. By letter sent on September 23, 1987, the Attorney General advised the company that numerous violations (at the new facility on West Highway 60), including failure to comply with the Abatement Order and the Amendment (1985-86), had been noted. On October 4, 1988, the operating facility was again inspected by MDNR The inspection results were transmitted to R and O Processors by letter dated November 18, 1988. The inspection disclosed both new and continuing violations, as listed in Attachment H. company was further advised that the State of Missouri was prepared to file suit against R and O Processors, Inc., but that the state would be willing to negotiate an amicable settlement. Subsequent to the receipt of this notice, the parties engaged in settlement negotiations, which culminated in the terms and conditions set forth in the Settlement Agreement (Attachment I).

The agreement was set up to help implement a schedule to correct the violations of the Missouri Hazardous Waste Law and Regulations occurring at R and O Processors. Although Robert W. Moffet consented and signed the settlement agreement, he has done nothing to effect the agreement.

On January 15, 1991, TAT was tasked by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Emergency Planning and Response (EPA/EP&R) Branch to conduct a removal assessment, and to document site conditions, collect and arrange for analysis of samples as necessary to determine, if a need for removal action existed, and to complete a general inventory of hazardous materials at the site (Attachment A). Samples of waste liquids, sludge, soil, and ground water were analyzed for total metals and cyanide. The samples indicated that the site conditions present a threat to public health and the environment.

#### 3.0 PROPERTY HISTORY

#### 3.1 Introduction and Property Description

The R and O Processors, Inc. facility is located at Section 10, Township 25, and Range 31 (Figure 3), described as beginning at the southeast corner of said northeast quarter of the northwest quarter, thence north 300 feet, thence west 180 feet, thence south 300 feet, thence east 180 feet to the point of beginning. The facility also has an easement to access Highway 60 (Attachment C).

Property identification was identified by a title search (Attachment C) and by the Deeds of Property (Attachments D and E).

#### 3.2 Chain of Ownership

In August 1972, Bessy A Lovelady sold Parcel 8, Section 10, Township 25, and Range 31 to Robert W. Moffet and Pauline Moffet, husband and wife. On August 19, 1981, Robert W. Moffet and Pauline Moffet sold Parcel 8.02, Section 10, Township 25, and Range 31 (the property described in section 3.1) to R and O Processors. The remaining property of Parcel 8, Section 10, Township 25, and Range 25 continues to be in the names of Robert W. and Pauline Moffet.

#### 3.3 Summary of Ownership and Operators

R and O Processors is the only owner of the property on which the facility was built and operated (Attachment C).

#### 4.0 POTENTIALLY RESPONSIBLE PARTIES

#### 4.1 Robert W. Moffet

Robert W. Moffet is identified as a Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) as current operator of the facility. He is listed as the sole owner of the company (Attachment F).

#### 4.2 R and O Processors

R and O Processors is identified as a Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) as current property owner (Attachment C).

#### 4.3 Others

Orval K. Taylor, Jr., as past co-owner of the facility, may also be a PRP. Other PRPs may exist (e.g. transporters and disposers of site generated hazardous waste) but due to the limited scope of this task information on Mr. Taylor or other PRPs was not pursued.

#### 5.0 PRP FINANCIAL INFORMATION

5.1 Information was sought from the Newton County Assessor's office and the Dunn and Bradstreet Report concerning the assets of the individuals identified as PRPs.





#### INTRODUCTION

The Ecology & Environment Technical Assistance Team (E & tasked by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Emergency Planning and Response Branch (EPA/EP&R) to conduct a removal ssessment at the R & O Processors Hwy 60 facility about three miles of the city of Granby, Missouri. Background information this site was obtained from the Missouri Department of concerning Natural Resources (MDNR) and a health and safety plan was produced prior to the initiation of site work. Site activity included the assessment and documentation of site conditions, the collection and arrangement for analysis of samples as necessary to determine whether there existed a need for removal action, and a general inventory of hazardous materials at the site. Samples of waste liquid and sludge, soil, and groundwater were analyzed for total metals and cyanide. The results showed levels of some inorganics in the soil and groundwater samples which indicate that the site conditions present a threat to public health and the environment.

#### BACKGROUND

The R & O Processors, Inc. Hwy 60 facility is located about three miles west of the city of Granby, Missouri, and less than a mile from the intersection of Highway Alternate 71 and 60 on Highway 60 in Newton County. The site can be reached by traveling south on Alternate 71 from I-44 to Highway 60, then traveling east on 60 to the site (Attachment A). The facility is on the south side of the highway. The building is light green with dark green trim and is visible from the highway. The site owner, Mr. Robert Moffet, lives on the site in a house just west of the facility. This is a rural area with a few other residences (<20) in the immediate area. These residences receive their water supply from private wells.

R & O Processors, Inc. was a metal finishing business that reformed various plating processes, including processes using cyanide. yanide processes included brass and copper plating on steel. Processes not using cyanide included zinc, chromium, nickel, and black oxide plating on steel and anodizing of aluminum. According to an MDNR

inspection report (October, 1988) tin plating has also been done in the past and wastes from this are still on site. Waste generated from these processes included spent stripping solutions bearing cyanide and metals, spent acids and caustics, and rinse solutions.

Storage of spent solutions was done in an outdoor concrete vat at south end of the building that is divided into three 20'x10'x4' compartments. The west and center vats stored spent acids and rinses from noncyanide processes and the east vat stored cyanide bearing fluids that were treated with sodium hypochlorite. The partition walls creating the compartments have gaps between them and the south outer wall, therefore all three compartments are interconnected. In October, 1988, an MDNR inspection revealed two leaks in the south outer wall and the soil was saturated next to the tanks on a dry day. At that time it was noted that no waste shipment had been made since the previous 1987 MDNR inspection and that the vat levels had decreased six to seven inches (~2000 gallon decrease). The vats were open to precipitation so this loss could not be attributed to evaporation and it was suspected that a large quantity of liquid had leaked from the vats.

A well outside the north end of the facility was used as a water source for the make up of the solutions. In the past, much of the spent solution was recycled. The spent solutions were drained from the process tanks into channels in the floor that ran to a collection sump in the waste treatment room. At the time of the last MDNR inspection this sump was full of sludge and any liquid entering it was overflowing directly into the outside storage vats. The recycling process involved pH adjustment with sulfuric acid or caustic soda, addition of a flocculating agent, and settling in a 5000 gallon tank. The liquid was then decanted in a 10,000 gallon reclaimed water storage tank. The sludge bottoms were centrifuged and the resulting water also decanted in the reclaimed water tank. The solids were to be drummed and shipped as a RCRA waste (F006). According to the MDNR report this system has not operated since about October, 1987. This report is included as Attachment B.

The owners of the facility had previously signed a consent agreement with MDNR that would have accomplished a corrective action at the facility, but the required work has not been completed. The owners now feel they are financially incapable of completing the work. Their attorney has indicated that the owners are planning to file personal and business bankruptcy. No further work on the part of the owners is anticipated at this site.

#### SITE ACTIVITY

On January 15, 1991, David Kinroth and Hieu Vu (E & E/TAT) met with Mr. Moffet on site. The facility was monitored with a Foxboro 128 organic vapor analyzer, an HCN monitox, and a Miniram particle monitor rior to a tour of the building led by Mr. Moffet. No readings above background levels were noted. The building was open to outside air and most of the liquids in the tanks were frozen at that time.

During the tour Mr. Moffet informed TAT of what each of the

tanks contained or was used for and the tanks were labeled with markers. A sketch of the facility was later produced and is included as Attachment C. Mr. Moffet informed TAT that no solvents to speak of were used on site in the 19 years of operation other than those in a small parts cleaner. This was in agreement with results from samples collected previously by MDNR that showed no notable levels of volatile organic compounds in the wastes on site. There was an estimated 30,000 gallons of liquid on site in the waste storage vats and process tanks and over 12,000 gallons of sludge.

The entire facility was very disorderly. Most of the tanks in the process lines were corroded and several were leaking. The pH of these solutions ranged from less than one to greater than twelve. Drums of sludge, caustic material, waste liquids, and product (acids, caustic etc.) were stored throughout the facility as well as outside Incompatible materials such as acids and NaCN were facility. the stored in close proximity to each other. An unsuccessful attempt to plug the leaks in the outside storage tanks with fiberglass patching material had been made and leakage continued from the east compartment. There was no vegetation present in the drainage pathway from the area of the leak south of the building for approximately 100 feet. This trainage pathway was observed to eventually run into a ditch that ρ£ flowed east from the site. Mr. Moffet said that this ditch probably eventually flowed into Shoal Creek. Plywood covers had also been constructed in an attempt to cover the compartments from precipitation however these were not effective.

Following the site tour, TAT collected a sample of well water from the Moffet residence well for total metals and cyanide analysis. According to Mr. Moffet this well is about 230 feet deep and probably from the same water table as the well north of the facility that had been used to make up the plating solutions. The well volume was calculated, the average flow rate from the tap was determined, and the well was purged for fifteen minutes to provide greater than three purge volumes in accordance with the SOP for sampling residential wells. TAT then tried to contact several residents north of the site in an attempt to collect a background well water sample. A suitable well could not be located at that time. TAT then left site to find a motel and refine the site sketch and plans for further sample collection.

On the following morning, January 16, 1991, TAT returned to the site to complete the sampling effort. Following the completion of sample collection on site, the site conditions were photodocumented. The photographic record is presented as Attachment D. TAT then left site to collect a background well water sample from a residence about one-half mile north of the site. This sample was also collected in accordance with the SOP for sampling of residential wells. A background soil sample was also collected from a wooded area northeast of the intersection of Highway 60 and Alternate 71. Table 1 summarizes it samples collected during this assessment effort. Refer to the site sketch for on site sample locations. All liquid samples were collected in cubitainers and solid samples in eight ounce jars. Liquid samples were preserved with HNO<sub>3</sub> for metals analysis and NaOH for cyanide analysis except on the samples from the cyanide rinse tank and the

H\_SO, tank, due to their extreme pH levels. Standard field documentation, including sample tags, field sheets, and chain-of-custody procedures were followed. Samples were then packed on ice in a cooler and shipped to GP Environmental Services in Gaithersburg, Maryland, for analysis.

#### THREAT

Sample results were received following review of the data by the TAT Analytical Services Group. The package received is presented as Attachment E. The results from the two process tanks sampled, the cyanide rinse tank in the copper/brass line (NVXO1005) and the sulfuric acid tank in the black oxide line (NVXO1008), show that process fluids remaining in the tanks on site range from pH>12 with high levels of cyanide and metals to pH<1 with high metal levels. The BNA results from the sulfuric acid tank sample indicated the presence of several acid-extractable semivolatile organic compounds at low levels, however the sample could not be adjusted to pH>11 due to the nature of the sample so no base/neutral analysis could be performed. Table 2 presents an overview of the levels of contaminants of concern present in the waste liquid and sludge samples, the soil sample near the leak from the waste storage vat, and the background soil sample.

Cyanide was not present at detectable levels in either the on-site of the background well water samples. Several metals were present at evels of concern in the well water sample collected from the Moffet residence that were not present at detectable levels in the background sample. These metal levels are compared against regulatory levels in Table 3 which were obtained from the EPA Office of Drinking Water document "Drinking Water Regulations and Health Advisories", dated April, 1990. According to OSWER directive 9360.1-01, "Interim Guidance on Removal Action Levels at Contaminated Drinking Water Sites", the action level for non-volatile, non-carcinogens, like cadmium and chromium, equals the Drinking Water Equivalent Level (DWEL).

The health effects of cadmium include the biochemical replacement of zinc in enzymes etc., high blood pressure, kidney damage, the destruction of testicular tissue and red blood cells, and toxicity to aquatic organisms. Chromium is an essential trace element, however hexavalent chromium is a possible carcinogen. While copper and zinc

are also essential trace elements and are not believed to pose significant health threats to humans, both are toxic to plant life at high levels. The possibility of synergistic/antagonistic relationships exists when metals are present in combination (Manahan, 1984).

Threats to the environment from this site include surface contamination and potential groundwater contamination. The drainage pathway from the leakage of the waste storage vat flows south toward a ditch. As mentioned before, the drainage area is lacking vegetation probably due to surface contamination. Soil samples collected by MDNR from the southeast property corner showed cyanide and high levels of metals, confirming that surface contamination had spread at least that far (see attachment B). From examination of the USGS 7.5 minute topographic quadrangle map of Granby, Missouri, it appears that the drainage ditch at the south property boundary runs east for approximately one mile before joining with Dry Branch Creek, which eventually flows into Shoal Creek to the north. Additional sampling around the drainage pathway south of the waste storage vats and in the drainage ditch would be required to fully delineate the extent of contaminant migration.

Because of the karst topography features in this region, which provides little natural filtration of contaminants as surface water quickly percolates through the ground, the surface contamination on site places the groundwater quality at risk. Contamination has been indicated by the results from the well water sample collected from the residence on site. Other residential wells in the area may also be at risk and sampling of these wells would be required to delineate the extent of groundwater contamination. Mining activity in this region will have to be considered in the evaluation of metal levels in these samples.

A threat also exists on this site due to the storage of incompatible materials in close proximity to each other which promotes the possibility of the release of toxic vapors. There are no fences surrounding the site and the building is open on two sides permitting unrestricted access to the building. This could place the local population at risk, especially any children that might live in the area.

#### Evaluation Of The Potential For A Removal Action

Any removal action must be done in accordance with 40 CFR 300.415 Subsection (b)(2) which lists factors to be considered in determining the appropriateness of a removal action. Cadmium and chromium were detected in the groundwater sample collected on site at orders of magnitude greater than the respective 20 ug/L and 200 ug/L DWEL levels, and high levels of copper and zinc were also detected. In addition to these factors, the site conditions meet criteria listed in 40 CFR 300.415 Subsection (b)(2) as follows:

(i) Actual or potential exposure to hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants by nearby populations, animals, or foodchain;

- (ii) Actual or potential contamination of drinking water supplies or sensitive ecosystems;
- (iii) Hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants in drums, barrels, tanks, or other bulk storage containers, that may pose a threat of release;
- (iv) High levels of hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants in soils largely at or near the surface, that may migrate.
- (v) Weather conditions that may cause hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants to migrate or be released...

#### Recommendations

The conditions existing at the R & O Processors — Hwy 60 facility indicate that a removal recommendation is warranted. Cadmium and chromium were detected in the groundwater sample collected on site at orders of magnitude greater than their respective action levels. High levels of copper and zinc were also detected in the groundwater. These metals were not present in detectable levels in the background sample collected. Contaminated soil also exists on site. Additional sampling of soil, creek sediment, and groundwater would be necessary to fully delineate the extent of contaminant migration and the scope of a leaking waste storage vat to mitigate the release of the contaminated liquid. The liquids remaining in the process tanks will have to be hazard categorized prior to bulking to determine any incompatibilities.


On site treatment options may be feasible and could reduce costs of shipping and disposal of hazardous waste. A treatment process for the destruction of cyanide in water has already been demonstrated to be cost effective at another site. Bench tests to determine the cost effectiveness of the treatment of sludge contaminated with cyanide and metals could begin before removal actions are initiated at this site.





#### HAZARDOUS WASTE COMPLIANCE INSPECTION REPORT

#### INTRODUCTION:

On October 4, 1988, an inspection was conducted at R&O Processors, Inc. of Granby in Newton County, Missouri. This inspection was to determine the facility's compliance with the Missouri Hazardous Waste Management Law and Regulations. The Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) was represented at this inspection by Mr. Tom Judge of the Division of Environmental Quality's Waste Management Program. The facility was represented by Mr. Robert Moffet, President of the company, and by Mr. Daniel Moffet, Operation/Maintenance/Environmental Supervisor of the plant. Also present during parts of the inspection were Mr. Nylen (Lee) Allphin, Mr. Michael T. Chapman, and Mr. Mark D. Smith, acting as consultants to R&O Processors, Inc. on business and technical matters. Mr. Allphin was the principal spokesman for the facility. Also on site for MDNR on this day were Mr. Larry Alderson of the Laboratory Services Program and Mr. Gale Roberts of the Springfield Regional Office who were conducting a sampling investigation which will be separately reported. R&O Processors, Inc. is a metal finishing plant with various plating processes. The company has seven employees including both Messrs. Moffet. Items plated are machine parts and stampings. done on purchase orders. Processes using cyanide include brass plating on steel and copper plating on steel. Processes not using cyanide include zinc plating on steel, chromium plating on steel, black oxide plating on steel, nickel plating on steel, and anodizing aluminum. Tin plating has been done in the past and tin plating fluids are currently stored on-site.

The plating processes consist of a series of fiberglass vats used for cleaning, pickling, plating, various rinses, and bright dipping. Metal parts are contained in small perforated polypropylene barrels and various racks and baskets which rotate or are dipped in the vats. The barrels, racks, or baskets are moved by hand from vat to vat. There are five lines which include the brass/copper line (also used for nickel), the zinc line, the black oxide line, the aluminum anodizing line, and the chrome line. The brass/copper line consists of vats for alkaline cleaner, water rinse, HCl acid, cyanide strip/rinse, brass cyanide plating solution, final rinse, dryer (oven). Other vats contain nickel plating solution (nickel sulfate, nickel chloride, boric acid) and copper cyanide plating solution. The chromic acid tank is used for bright dip in the brass line. The zinc line consists of vats for alkaline cleaner, water rinse, HCl acid, alkaline zinc plating solution, water rinse, water rinse, bright dip (patented solution called blue bright), water rinse, water rinse. The black oxide basket line includes cleaning by hand then vats for water rinse, alkaline black oxide solution, water rinse. The anodized aluminum rack line consists of vats for: alkaline etch cleaner, water rinse, low pH patented desmut solution, water rinse, nitric acid, water rinse. sulfuric acid, water rinse, water rinse. The chrome line consists of a chromic acid tank and a rinse tank. The vats in the various lines are not strictly used in sequence, with some vats such as acid pickling and rinsing used several times alternatively before going to a plating vat. No plating or processing was observed taking place during the inspection.

Interim storage of spent acids and rinse is done in an outdoor, uncovered, large concrete-walled tank that has two concrete wall partitions dividing the tank into three equal compartments with measurements of 20' x 10' x 4' each. The west partition wall had collapsed and has been set back in place, leaving a visible gap. The east partition wall had pulled away from the south outer wall leaving a one-inch gap. All three compartments of the tank were therefore interconnected. The sludge/liquid levels in all three parts of the tank were equal and provided about two feet of freeboard. The concrete tank appeared to be leaking at the southeast corner from a crack extending the visible height of the wall, and at the southwestern corner of that same tank another crack extended the visible height of the wall. Both cracks exhibited significant moisture and staining (see attached photo), and the ground at the southeast corner appeared saturated. Fluids are routinely added to this tank; nothing has been removed since at least 1985 and the tank levels have declined approximately 6" from the levels reported for 1987's inspection.

The west portion and center portion of the concrete tank are used to store spent acids and rinses from all non-cyanide processes except chrome plating. Fluids are dumped into grated open channels in the concrete floor of the plating building. These flow into the center compartment of the outside concrete tank. The open channels were clear at the time of inspection. This compartment had about two feet of freeboard, and the remaining two feet contained sludge. The adjacent west compartment appeared to contain two to three inches of water over 1.75 feet of sludge. The east compartment of the concrete tank is used to store cyanide-bearing fluids (F007, F009) which have been treated with sodium hypochlorite. This tank contains about a foot of supernatant above a foot of sludge. No shipment of this F007/F009 waste has ever been made and additions to tank contents have taken place continuously since 1985, in quantities subject to the amount of plating activity.

It cannot be documented that any wastewater has ever been treated by the equipment in place, and no shipment of treatment sludge has ever been made from the facility. The wastewater treatment system has not been operated nor permitted under NPDES during the past year. All makeup water has been from the deep well on the site. At the time of inspection, Mr. Robert Moffet estimated that approximately 200 gallons of sludge and wastewater have been discharged to the system each month for the past year. The proposed process water recovery system would have used pH adjustment with sulfuric acid or caustic soda, addition of flocculating agent, settling in the 5000-gallon settlement tank with the decanted liquid going to the 10,000-gallon reclaimed water tank and bottoms going to the centrifuge. Centrifuged liquid would go to the reclaimed water tank and solids drummed and shipped as F006. Since the water recovery system has not operated in the past year and the floor drains empty directly into a 5' x 3' x 4' sump adjacent to the water treatment machinery, the sump has become brim-full of sludge and anything discharged to it is overflowing directly to the outside tanks. It should be carefully noted that until this unit recieves a discharge permit for compliance with Clean Water laws, any operation of this unit would constitute treatment of hazardous waste without a permit. (Please see 40 CFR 265.1(c)(10) and 40 CFR 260.10 - "wastewater treatment unit".)

The other registered waste stream was F009 spent stripping solution bearing cyanide from stripping zinc and copper from steel parts. A 24-drum shipment of this spent stripper (listed as F009, D001, D006, D008 as the result of testing) containing 1,320 gallons was made on September 15, 1986, to Chemical Waste Management in Sulfur (Carlyss), Louisiana. At the time of inspection none of this waste was in storage, except as mixed into the outside tank contents.

UNSATISFACTORY FEATURES: Federal regulations cited have been adopted by reference.

- 1. Releases of hazardous waste to the environment not addressed. 40 CFR 265.15(c), 40 CFR 265.31, 40 CFR 265.194(c), and 40 CFR 265.196
- Storage of hazardous waste without a permit or interim status. 40 CFR 270.1(c) and 40 CFR 262.34
- 3. No waste analysis plan and no program of regular or routine waste analysis being conducted. 40 CFR 265.13
- 4. No restricted access sign at entry to tank walkway or at doorway to Wastewater Treatment Room. 40 CFR 265.14(c)
- 5. Facility inspections are not adequate and not documented. 40 CFR 265.15 and 40 CFR 265.195(c)
- 6. No personnel training plan or documentation. 40 CFR 265.16
- 7. The tank storage area did not possess internal or external communication devices or spill control equipment. 40 CFR 265.32
- 8. No contingency plan or emergency procedures available at the time of the inspection. 40 CFR Part 265 Subpart D
- 9. No operating record for the facility. 40 CFR 265.73
- 10. No biennial reports filed by the facility. 40 CFR 265.75
- 11. No closure plan plan for the facility. 40 CFR 265.112
- 12. No financial assurance for closure of the facility. 40 CFR 265.143
- 13. No financial assurance of liability coverage for the facility. 40 CFR 265.147
- 14. Failure to have the condition of existing storage tanks assessed and documented by an independent registered professional engineer. 40 CFR 265.191

#### COMMENTS:

The inspection began with a facility tour which started at the outdoor storage tanks on the south exterior of the process building (see attached diagram). Mr. Nylen (Lee) Allphin was spokesman for the company and was present during all points of the inspection. Although no waste shipments had been made since the last inspection nor any processing of tank contents, tank contents appeared to have decreased 2,000 gallons or more by dropping 6"-7". These tanks are open to rainwater, so attributing the decline to evaporation is not reasonable. In addition, Mr. Moffet estimated during questioning that he has discharged 200 gallons/month to the tanks in the last year. As two large cracks and leaks in the outer wall of the tanks are highly visible (see photos and diagram) and soil was saturated next to the tanks on a dry day, it may be suspected that fairly large quantities of liquids have been leaking from the tanks and continue to do so. This apparent chronic release of hazardous waste is in addition to past documented overflows from the tanks. The outdoor tanks are now behind fencing and have been labeled.

The inspection then proceeded to the main production floor. No processing was observed taking place at the time of inspection. The problem of overflowing floor drains and gutters and waste mixing and mingling on the shop floor that had been observed at previous inspections was not observed on this occasion. The inspection proceeded to the Chrome Room where it was observed that neither the door giving access to the walkway above the outside tanks nor its vicinity contained the required sign restricting access with the words "Danger-Unauthorized Personnel Keep Out".

The Wastewater Treatment Room was next inspected. The wastewater treatment system has not been used in the last year, and all waste discharged to the gutters and floor drains from process units passes through a sump and overflows into the outside tanks. The sump was observed to be 5' x 3' in area and was said by Mr. Moffet to be 4' in depth. At the time of the inspection, the sump was observed to be absolutely full of sludge, with little or no supernatant. The 10,000 gallon "flocculation tank" appeared empty. As the 5,000 gallon "settling tank" could not be readily inspected, it was not determined if this tank contained any raw or unprocessed waste. No plant personnel questioned knew if this tank contained waste at the time of the inspection. As storage of hazardous waste is taking place in the Wastewater Treatment Room sump, the facility should at least provide restricted access signs as described above. Further deficiencies noted were the lack of any communication or spill control equipment in proximity to the indoor or outdoor storage areas.

The inspection concluded with an interview of management personnel and a review of plant records and other paperwork. After a search, the file of manifests was located for inspection. No shipments of waste had been initiated in the last year since the previous inspection. None of the other required records or plans were available or existing. There was no operating record. There was no waste analysis plan or analysis records for waste going into treatment or storage, although some analyses of tank contents had been conducted for disposal purposes. There were no inspection records nor a written schedule and criteria for inspections. There was no personnel training plan nor any records able to provide the necessary documentation of personnel training. There was no contingency plan for the facility. No Biennial Facility Report has been prepared or submitted by the facility. There are no financial assurances for closure or liability. No assessment of hazardous waste storage tanks by an independent professional engineer had been documented or conducted.

The entire situation and conditions under which hazardous waste has been stored for years in tanks is extremely serious. The procedural and financial safeguards designed to protect workers, the community, and the environment which are embodied in the required plans, financial assurances, security and storage requirements, and physical specifications for the tanks are either inadequate or completely absent. Especially serious is the company's inability or unwillingness to address the chronic and easily visible release of hazardous waste to the environment from the outdoor tanks. The inspection did not reveal any attempt that had been made to arrest or effectively address this release in the past year. The original crack and leak have gotten much worse, and another large crack has appeared. The tanks have not been covered, allowing rainwater to increase the head which drives the release. No apparent attempt has been made to patch or stop the leaks. No attempt has been made to stop discharge to the tanks, determine the actual type and amount of discharges to the tanks, or determine the volume of waste being lost through the release. No attempt has been made to assess the true extent of damage or to remedy damage to the environment, although this responsibility is explicit in 10 CSR 25-7.265(2)(J) and 40 CFR 265.196, and should be obvious. As the facility is the subject of

enforcement action and litigation in this matter, the company cannot plead it is ignorant of the fact it has a significant release to the environment that is getting progressively worse.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. Immediately cease discharge of waste to the outside tanks. Prevent the entry of precipitation to the outside tanks. Immediately assess the need to take any actions to prevent failure of the tanks and take any appropriate actions. Take action to prevent the development of more leaks from the tanks, and to seal existing leaks. Empty the tanks as soon as possible, pursuant to 40 CFR 265.196, and properly dispose of the hazardous waste they presently contain. Cease storing beyond the time allotted for nonpermitted non-interim status facilities.
- 2. Thoroughly assess the type and extent of contamination that has occurred at the facility. Prepare a closure plan and submit it to MDNR for approval. Implement the approved plan.
- Provide all storage areas with appropriate restricted access signs, communication devices, and spill control equipment.
- 4. Produce, implement and document a personnel training plan adequate to satisfy the requirements of 40 CFR 265.16.
- 5. Conduct, document and act upon facility inspections adequate to satisfy 40 CFR 265.15 and 40 CFR 265.195(c). This must include appropriate response to leaks.
- 6. Develop, implement and document a contingency plan and emergency procedures adequate to satisfy 40 CFR Part 265 Subpart D.
- 7. Either provide a waste analysis plan, operating record and financial assurances for closure and liability coverage able to satisfy the requirements of the law and regulations or certify closure according to a plan approved by the Department of Natural Resources.



## SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The parties hereto having consented to the entry of this Settlement Agreement now therefore before the taking of any testimony and upon the pleadings, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED THAT;

An agreement is made this 29th day of August.

1989, between Robert W. Moffett, d/b/a R & O Processors, Inc., and the State of Missouri by and through William L. Webster, Attorney General of Missouri, and the Missouri Hazardous Waste Commission.

# I. Jurisdiction

This court has jurisdiction of the subject matter herein and of the parties consenting hereto pursuant to the Missouri Hazardous Waste Management Law and regulations promulgated thereunder.

# II. Benefit and Duty

The provisions of this Consent Judgement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the parties to this action, their agents, servants, employees, successors and assigns. In addition, the provisions of this Settlement Agreement shall apply to all persons, firms, corporations and other entities who are or will be acting in concert and in privity with or on behalf of the parties to this action or their agents, servants, employees and successors.

## III. Background

R & O Processors, Inc., located in Grandby, Missouri, is a metal finishing business owned and operated by Robert W. Moffett. On or about June 27, 1985, the Missouri Department of personnel responded to a request Resources assistance involving the possible release of hazardous materials at the R & O Main and Church Streets abandoned business locations. Subsequently on November 26, 1985, a RCRA inspection of the facility revealed several violations including storage of hazardous waste without a permit or interim status and allowing cyanide contaminated wastewater, a listed hazardous waste to overflow from outside holding tanks onto the ground. A Notice of Violation was issued immediately. On May 27, 1986, an Abatement Order was issued to the company and on December 10, 1986, an amendment to said Abatement Order was issued. the Order nor the Amendment was appealed and the company has taken no action to correct the violations cited therein.

March 27, 1987, the matter was referred to the Office of the Attorney General for legal action. By letter sent on or about September 23, 1987, the Attorney General of Missouri advised the company that numerous violations, including failure to comply with the Abatement Order and the Amendment had been noted. October 4, 1988, the facility was again inspected by Missouri Department of Natural Resources personnel. The results of said inspection were transmitted to R & O Processors by letter dated November 18, 1988. The inspection disclosed both new and continuing violations. The company was further advised that the State of Missouri was prepared to file suit against R & O Processors, Inc., but that the state would be willing to negotiate an amicable settlement. Subsequent to the receipt of this notice the parties engaged in settlement negotiations which culminated in the terms and conditions set forth in this Settlement Agreement.

# IV. Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to provide for the implementation of a schedule to correct the violations of the Missouri Hazardous Waste Law and regulations occurring at the R & O Processing facilities.

# V. <u>Performance</u>

The company shall cause the work to be completed in accordance with and within the time limits of the schedule set forth as follows:

. . . . .

- 1. Immediately cease discharge of any waste or wastewater to the outside storage tanks. Do not discharge any waste or wastewater to the outside tanks until MDNR's Waste Management Program provides an approval that such discharge will not violate the requirements of 40 CFR 265 Subpart J and 10 CSR 25-7.265(2)(J).
- 2. Within ninety (90) days of the date of this order, dispose of hazardous waste in containers, inside tanks, and outside tanks. Decontamination of the outside tanks should occur during the indicated period.
- 3. Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the date of this order, develop and submit a cleanup plan and schedule for: soil sampling and analysis which will identify the horizontal and vertical extent of all areas contaminated with cyanide or metals above background concentrations; excavation or other remediation of contaminated soil; and steps for final disposal (i.e., containerization, transportation, final disposition, etc.). Said schedule will make provision for submittal or reports to MDNR upon completion of each separate phase of the plan.
- 4. Upon MDNR's approval or modification as agreed by the parties of the plan and schedule noted in item three (3), implement the plan according to the approved schedule.
- 5. If MDNR determines that, based upon reports submitted pursuant to items three (3) and four (4) or upon MDNR's own investigations, evidence exists of a potential release to the groundwater, within 45 days of notification of said potential

release, the company shall develop and implement a groundwater monitoring plan and schedule and implement such plan and schedule upon MDNR approval, in compliance with 40 CFR 265 Subpart F.

- 6. Beginning immediately, comply with the statutory and regulatory requirements for generators of hazardous waste including, but not limited to, those noted in § 260.380, RSMo, and 10 CSR 25-5.262. In particular, since the company has generated or accumulated over 1000 kg of hazardous waste, in one month the company shall develop and implement a personnel training plan, a contingency plan, and emergency preparedness and prevention measures adequate to comply with 10 CSR 25-5.262(2) referenced to 40 CFR 265 Subparts C and D, and 40 CFR 265.16.
- 7. The time for compliance with any of the above actions may be extended by the agreement of the MDNR, upon submission of adequate justification.

# VI. Stipulated Penalty

R & O Processors consents to and is herein fined Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), the payment of which is suspended upon the condition that R & O fully performs the conditions of this Agreement and does not violate the Missouri Hazardous Waste Management Law and regulations. Further violations of said law and regulations promulgated thereunder occurring subsequent to the date of this Agreement shall be punished by enforcing and executing said stipulated and suspended penalty at the rate of

five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per day of violation. The procedure for enforcing and executing the suspended penalty shall be as follows:

- A. The State of Missouri, upon discovering any violation of R & O Processor's facility shall notify the Company by a Notice of Violation.
- B. R & O Processors shall have twenty (20) days from the date of the Notice of Violation to determine whether to voluntarily pay five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the violation. If the Company agrees to pay the penalty, it shall do so no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the Notice of Violation.
- C. If R & O Processors determines that the alleged violation did not occur or is excused by an act of God, war, strike, riot or other catastrophe as enumerated in § 260.240.3, RSMo 1986, the company may elect to submit the dispute to the Missouri Hazardous Waste Commission for resolution. Failure to petition the Commission to resolve said dispute within twenty (20) days from the date of the Notice of Violation will be deemed an acceptance of the state's assessment and R & O Processors will pay the executed penalty of Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) per day of violation.

# VI. Force Majeure

Any delay or failure of R & O Processors, Inc., in the performance of its obligations under this agreement shall be excused if, and to the extent caused by an act of God, war,

strike, riot or other catastrophe including, but not limited to, fire, flood, windstorm, inclement weather, explosions or court injunction or order and/or cause or causes beyond the reasonable control of the party affected provided that a prompt notice of such delay is given by such party to the other party and both of the parties hereto shall be diligent in attempting to remove such cause or causes. Performance of this Settlement Agreement shall be resumed upon removal or a cessation of the cause or causes for a suspension of performance.

# VII. Amendment of Consent Judgment

This Consent Judgment may be modified or amended only by a writing executed by the company and the plaintiffs and approved by the Court.

## VIII. Continued Jurisdiction

The Court retains jurisdiction of this suit for the purpose of making any order or decree which it may deem at any time to be necessary to carry out this agreement. Any disputes regarding the interpretation of this agreement may be submitted to this Court for resolution.

# IX. Use of Judgment

This Consent Judgment constitutes a final settlement of all claims arising out of the alleged violations occurring at R & O Processors, Inc., up to and including the date this decree is entered. As and the autumn charge my is seen in God, were
