EPA completes 5th Five-Year Review of Lowry Landfill Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) conducts five-year reviews of Superfund sites to ensure that remedial activities protect public health and the environment, and perform as intended by site decision documents. The methods, findings and conclusions of reviews are documented in a five-year review (FYR) report. In addition, FYR reports identify issues found during the review, if any, and document recommendations to address them.

Completed in early 2022, the fifth Five-Year Review (FYR) of the Lowry Landfill Superfund Site included the findings of several site inspections; interviews with the work settling defendants, local and state government officials and community members; and an assessment of all environmental data.

2022 FYR Conclusions

The EPA has determined in the 2022 Five-Year Review that the remedial activities at the Lowry Landfill Superfund site are protective of human health and the environment.

The remedial components and institutional controls in place at the site are protective of human health and the environment. The area around the site consists of ongoing landfilling operations as well as residential areas. While monitoring and other operations and maintenance activities are ongoing, institutional controls, including deed restrictions, water rights, zoning, and ordinances ensure nearby residential areas are not impacted by the site contamination.
