RE: MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT NO. 39 - APRIL 1991

Dear Mr. Dunkelman:

In accordance with Section VII.B.1 of the Administrative Consent Order (EPA Docket No. 88-08) for the Hassayampa Landfill Remedial Investigation / Feasibility Study (RI/FS), this Monthly Progress Report has been prepared for the reporting period from April 1-30, 1991. Two additional copies of Progress Report No. 39 are enclosed herewith.

### PROGRESS DURING REPORTING PERIOD

Progress made during April 1991 chiefly included meetings regarding the draft Baseline Risk Assessment and field work at the landfill, and is summarized as follows:

- 1. Meetings of the Hassayampa Technical Work Group (TWG) were held on April 3 and 9 to discuss comments on the draft Risk Assessment submitted by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the hazardous waste area at the Hassayampa Landfill. The meetings were held in San Francisco at the offices of EPA Region 9.
- 2. On April 4, you telefaxed two letters to me. One letter documented EPA acceptance and approval of the final Remedial Investigation Report, dated February 7, 1991. The other letter documented EPA acceptance and approval for the scope of work given in my letter to you dated January 25, 1991.
- 3. On April 5, I sent you a tentative schedule for the field program for the Hassayampa project and additional telephone conversations have been held with you and Jackie Maye, of Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ), to provide updated information on the field schedule.

- 4. On April 8, I sent you a letter summarizing the discussions held at the April 3 meeting regarding groundwater flow and transport modeling for the draft Risk Assessment.
- 5. On April 22, I sent you a letter giving the proposed scope for the additional soil borings and pesticide sampling requested by EPA for the hazardous waste area. This letter also contained a status report for the ongoing field program.
- 6. On April 23, you sent me a letter documenting EPA acceptance and approval of the scope of work given in my April 22 letter to you.
- 7. The field program for the landfill began on April 9. Unit B monitor well MW-6UB was constructed about 30 feet south from Unit A monitor well MW-6UB from April 9 through 13. Well MW-6UB was developed on April 13 and April 16, and a pumping test was conducted on April 23. Groundwater samples for laboratory chemical analyses were obtained from well MW-6UB during development operations and during the pumping test. In addition, a sample of the water used to drill well MW-6UB was obtained from the driller's water truck on April 15. Jackie Maye and Mike Leach, of ADEQ, observed construction operations for well MW-6UB on April 12. Jackie Maye also observed field operations on April 23.
- 8. Unit B monitor well MW-9UB was constructed about 118 feet southeast from well HS-2 from April 13 through 17. Well MW-9UB was developed on April 17, and a pumping test was conducted in May. Groundwater samples for laboratory chemical analyses were obtained from well MW-9UB during development operations.
- 9. Unit A monitor well MW-9UA was constructed about 87 feet southeast from well HS-2 from April 18 through April 25. Well MW-9UA was developed on April 25, and a pumping test was conducted in May. Groundwater samples for laboratory chemical analyses were obtained from well MW-9UA during development operations.
- 10. Unit A monitor well MW-10UA was constructed about 17 feet southwest from well HS-3 from April 25 through 29. Well MW-10UA was developed on April 28 and 29. Groundwater samples for laboratory chemical analyses were obtained from well MW-10UA during development operations.
- 11. Unit B monitor well MW-10UB was constructed about 16 feet southeast from well HS-3 from April 29 through May 2. Well MW-10UB was developed in May. No groundwater samples were obtained from well MW-10UB during April.
- 12. Soil boring SB-17 was drilled through Pit 3c on April 30 and May 1, and samples of the pit contents and underlying soils were obtained for laboratory chemical analyses. Soil boring SB-18 was drilled through

Pit 3b on May 1, and samples of the pit contents and underlying soils were obtained for laboratory chemical analyses. Soil boring SB-18 was drilled to a few feet below the base of Pit 3b. Jackie Maye and you observed soil boring operations on May 1.

13. Progress continued on the FS.

# NOTABLE RESULTS/EVENTS DURING REPORTING PERIOD

The following revisions have been made to the distribution list for project deliverables: the address for Terry A. Thompson, the representative for AT&T, has changed; the law firm and address for G. Van Velsor Wolf has changed; and Elizabeth M. Powell has replaced Kevin Milliken. A revised distribution list is enclosed herewith.

# SUMMARY OF DELIVERABLES SUBMITTED DURING REPORTING PERIOD

Deliverables scheduled to be submitted by Respondents under the Consent Order during April 1991 included: Progress Report No. 38, dated April 15; and the Data Submittal for March, dated April 30.

#### WORK SCHEDULE DURING NEXT REPORTING PERIOD

Work scheduled for May 1991 consists chiefly of:

- 1. A meeting will be scheduled between Jim Mathieu, of Montgomery & Associates, and Gordon Ballentine, of PRC Environmental Management, Inc., to discuss an analytical modeling approach for the second draft of the EPA Risk Assessment.
- 2. Montgomery & Associates will submit to EPA a draft summary of the results of the April 3 and 9 meetings of the TWG.
- 3. Work will continue for the field program. The soil gas survey is tentatively scheduled to begin on May 28. EPA and ADEQ have indicated that they have no interest in obtaining groundwater samples at the landfill until the next sampling round for well MW-6UB.
- 4. Continued work for the FS by the consultant team.
- 5. Preparation of the second draft of the EPA Risk Assessment by PRC.

# DELIVERABLES TO BE SUBMITTED DURING NEXT REPORTING PERIOD

Deliverables scheduled to be submitted by the Respondents under the Consent Order during May 1991 include: Progress Report No. 39; and pertinent data obtained or received during April 1991. EPA comments, if necessary, on Progress Report No. 39 are due within 15 days after EPA receives the Progress Report.
