Portland Harbor Superfund Site: Information Management and Institutional Control Plans

An Invitation to Advanced Data Users to Participate in a Needs Assessment



Purpose

Work to clean up the Portland Harbor Superfund Site will generate considerable amounts of data in addition to existing datasets. Under an agreement with EPA, the City of Portland and the State of Oregon through the Department of State Lands are developing a plan to centralize and make available to interested parties site-specific and harbor-wide cleanup data and information. To assist in this effort, the City and State are reaching out to stakeholders, including parties who may be more familiar with the technical aspects of Portland Harbor data, to participate in a needs assessment.

The purpose of the needs assessment is to (1) gather input on ways to ensure that information and data are managed and presented in a format that is consistent and useful and (2) gather input on how best to describe and document, track, and communicate the institutional controls (ICs) that will be a part of the Portland Harbor cleanup.


