Site Name: Shiloh Church Road Site, Property #2

Size: 4 acres

Existing Site Infrastructure: Electrical hook up is available on site. There is currently no operable water on site. The site does not have a septic system or sewer infrastructure.

Current Site Uses: A 1,680-square-foot building is available for redevelopment. It is currently vacant.

SETTING:

- The site is in a rural area of Halifax County, at the intersection of U.S. Highway 501 and Shiloh Church Road. Past site uses include a salvage yard, a gas station and a convenience store. Contaminated soils were discovered on the site.
- Nearby lands include residential, agricultural and forested areas. Site surroundings include several houses as well as forested land to the north and east.
- Property #2 is a 4-acre portion of the site under ownership of a private property owner and is currently for sale. It is zoned for agricultural use. Halifax County's Planning & Zoning Department must review and approve development plans for the site.
- Halifax County has economic development programs available to support site redevelopment. The county's Industrial Development Authority (IDA) focuses on increasing employment and economic growth across the area. REMEDIAL STATUS:

- The site is an EPA Superfund Program time-critical removal site. The site is not currently on the National Priorities List.
- In 2019, EPA began cleaning up the site. The cleanup includes digging up contaminated soil, treating it on site, and disposing of it at a facility off site.
